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Switching the earbuds

(Only for models supplied with earbuds)

The M-size earbuds are attached to the headphones at the time of purchase. If the M-size earbuds do not suit your ears, replace them with the SS-, S-, or L-size earbuds. Select earbuds with the appropriate size for each ear.

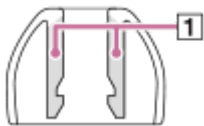
Use earbuds that fit your ears comfortably and snugly. Proper earbud sizes let you enjoy bass sound and the Noise canceling function more effectively.

Confirming the size of the earbuds

The method of confirming the size of the earbuds varies depending on the body color of your player.

Body of player: black

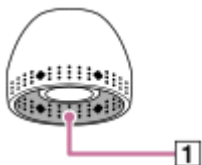
You can distinguish the different sizes by the color inside the earbuds (1).



- SS: red
- S: orange
- M: green
- L: light blue

Body of player: color other than black

There are dots (1) around the inner edges of the earbuds. The number of rows of dots indicates the size.



- SS: 1 row
- S: 2 rows
- M: 3 rows
- L: 4 rows

Removing the earbuds

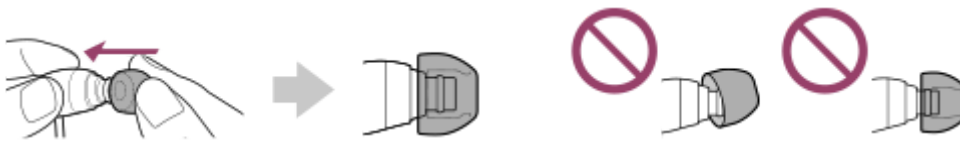
Hold the headphones, and then twist and pull the earbuds.
If the earbuds are slippery, wrap them in a soft dry cloth.



Attaching the earbuds

Firmly push in the earbuds until they completely cover the tips of the headphones.

Be sure to attach the earbuds straight, so that the earbuds are not diagonal to the tips of the headphones. To prevent the earbuds from detaching or getting stuck in your ears, be sure to attach the earbuds correctly.



Hint

- When the earbuds become worn, contact the nearest Sony dealer or Sony Service Center.
- If the earbuds get dirty, remove them from the headphones. Then, hand-wash the earbuds with a neutral detergent. After washing, drain off the water and reattach the earbuds.

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Attaching the soft case (NW-A100TPS only)

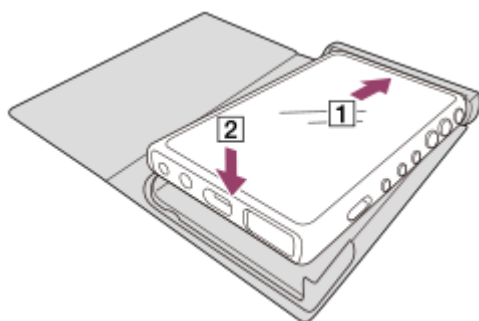
You can enjoy the ambience of the original Walkman with an animation of a rotating tape. Perform the following operations.

- Attach the cassette-player-style soft case.
- Turn on the [Display tape playback screen] function.
- Display the playback screen in “Music player”.

The soft case is supplied with the NW-A100TPS only.

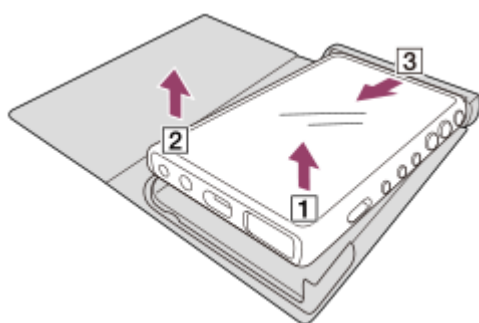
Attaching the soft case

1. Insert the top of the player into the top part of the soft case ([1]).
2. Push the bottom of the player into the soft case ([2]).



Removing the soft case

1. Lift the bottom of the player out of the bottom of the soft case ([1] and [2]).
2. Pull the top of the player out of the top of the soft case ([3]).



Note

- Check the location of the N-Mark on the player before attaching the soft case.
- Make sure that the player is securely fitted inside the soft case.
- Observe the following precautions. Otherwise, the soft case may become deformed or break.
 - Do not apply strong pressure when you attach or remove the soft case.
 - Do not wrap the headphone cable around the soft case during use.
- Do not put stickers, etc. on the soft case.
- Do not use commercial solvents such as benzene or alcohol to clean the soft case. These solvents may cause discoloration or deterioration.

Do not place this product close to medical devices.

This product (including accessories) has magnet(s) which may interfere with pacemakers, programmable shunt valves for hydrocephalus treatment, or other medical devices. Do not place this product close to persons who use such medical devices. Consult your doctor before using this product if you use any such medical device.

Notes regarding replacements or repairs

- Due to repairs, parts of the player may be replaced, or the player may be replaced with a similar model. In this case, the replacement(s) will have a different design because the NW-A100TPS is a limited item.
- Because the soft case is a limited item, the replacement product may not have the same design.

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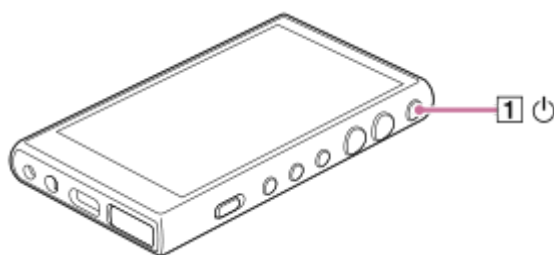
Configuring the initial setup

When you turn on the player for the first time, a screen for the initial setup will appear.
The following items can be set as necessary later.

- Wi-Fi setup
- Google™ Account

1 Hold down the (power) button () for 5 seconds until the player turns on.

The player may not turn on if the battery level is low. Charge the player for about 30 minutes.



If necessary, select a language and go to the next step.

2 Confirm the content of [End user license agreement], and then tap [Agree].

3 Follow the onscreen instructions.

The Home screen appears when the initial setup is complete.

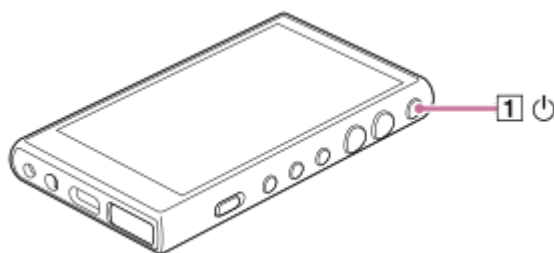



Turning the power on

1 Hold down the (power) button () for 5 seconds until the player turns on.

When you turn on the player for the first time, a screen for the initial setup will appear. Follow the onscreen instructions to complete the setup.



Hint

- The screen will turn off automatically if you do not operate the player for a certain period of time. To turn on the screen, press the  (power) button ().
- To conserve the battery power, set [Auto power off]. The player will turn off automatically if you do not operate the player for a certain period of time after you pause playback. Swipe the Home screen upwards. Tap the menu items in the following order.
 [Settings] – [Battery] – [Auto power off].

Note

- The player may not turn on if the battery level is low. Charge the player for about 30 minutes.

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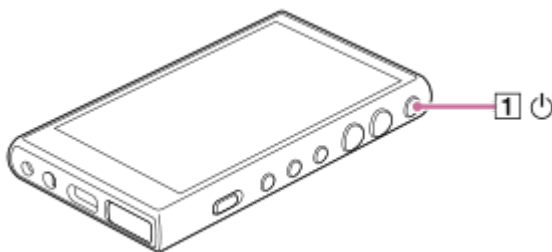

- 1 Hold down the  (power) button () for 2 seconds while the screen is turned on.



- 2 Tap [Power off].

Hint

- To conserve the battery power, set [Auto power off]. The player will turn off automatically if you do not operate the player for a certain period of time after you pause playback. Swipe the Home screen upwards. Tap the menu items in the following order.
 [Settings] – [Battery] – [Auto power off].

Preventing unintentional operations (HOLD)

You can lock the operating buttons on the player to prevent accidental button operations.

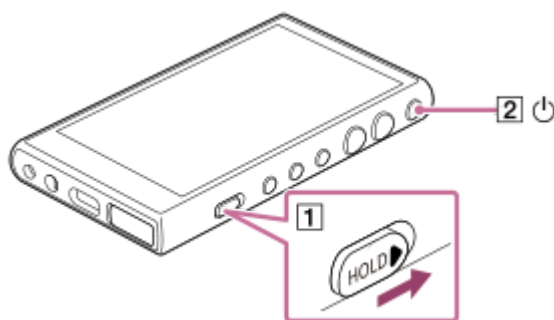
1 Slide the HOLD switch (1) upwards.

The HOLD function is enabled. The status icon (HOLD) will appear in the status bar. You cannot operate the following buttons.

- Playback operating buttons
- +/- (volume) buttons

You can operate the following parts even while you have enabled the HOLD function.

- ⏻ (power) button (2)
- Touch screen



Hint

- Slide the HOLD switch (1) downwards to release the HOLD function.
- When you carry the player, press the ⏻ (power) button (2) to turn off the screen. You can prevent unintentional operations on the touch screen.

Charging the battery

1 Connect the player to a running computer via USB.

The charge lamp will light up.
When charging is complete, the charge lamp turns off.



2 Disconnect the player from the computer.

Hint

- For details on how long it takes to charge the battery fully, see [Specifications].

Note

- If charging is insufficient, the computer may not recognize the player. In this case, the screen of the player will not turn on. Charge the player sufficiently. The computer will recognize the player after about 30 minutes of charging.

Reducing the battery consumption

You can reduce the battery consumption by using the player in the following manner.
The battery life depends on usage conditions. For details on the battery life, see [Battery life].


- Turn off the power manually when you do not use the player.
- Turn off apps when you are not using them.
- Set [Auto power off]. The player will turn off automatically if you do not operate the player for a certain period of time after you pause playback.
Swipe the Home screen upwards. Tap the menu items in the following order.
 [Settings] – [Battery] – [Auto power off].
- Adjust the screen brightness.
- Turn off all sound adjustments.
- Turn off the Bluetooth function when you are not using it.
- Turn off the NFC function when you are not using it.
- Turn off the Wi-Fi function when you are not using it.
- Turn off the Noise canceling function.
- Turn off Ambient sound mode.

Notes on charging the battery

- Always use the supplied USB Type-C cable.
- Firmly insert the USB Type-C cable all the way in. Charging will not start until you insert the USB Type-C cable completely.
- The charging time depends on the battery usage conditions.
- When the battery is sufficiently charged but the battery life has dropped to about half of its normal span, the battery may be worn out. Contact the nearest Sony dealer or Sony Service Center.
- The computer may not recognize the player in the following situations.
 - When you connect the player to the computer for the first time
 - When the player has not been used for a long period of timeCharge the player for about 30 minutes. The player may start operating normally.
- Charge the battery at an ambient temperature from 5 °C to 35 °C (41 °F to 95 °F).
When the ambient temperature exceeds the recommended range,  appears on the status bar and then charging is forcibly terminated. Even when the environment is within the recommended temperature range, the internal temperature of the player may become too hot. In this case, you may be unable to fully charge the battery.
- The battery can be recharged about 500 times from a completely depleted state. The exact number of times may vary depending on the usage conditions.
- To prevent deterioration of the battery, charge the battery at least once every 6 months.
- Charging is not guaranteed when you use a homebuilt or modified computer.
- Charging from a USB hub is only guaranteed when you use a self-powered USB hub that carries an authorized logo.
- When you connect the player to a computer for a long period of time, connect the computer to an AC power supply. Otherwise, the computer's battery may run out.
- While the player is connected to a computer, observe the following cautions. Otherwise, the player may not function properly.
 - Do not turn on the computer.
 - Do not restart the computer.
 - Do not wake the computer from sleep mode.
 - Do not shut down the computer.
- The player may become hot during usage conditions such as charging, or charging and using an app at the same time. This is not a malfunction.
- The battery indicator does not correspond exactly to the remaining battery level. Refer to the battery indicator as a guide.
- When you charge the player using a computer, do not remove the USB Type-C cable while data is transferring. If you disconnect the USB Type-C cable, data on the player may be lost.

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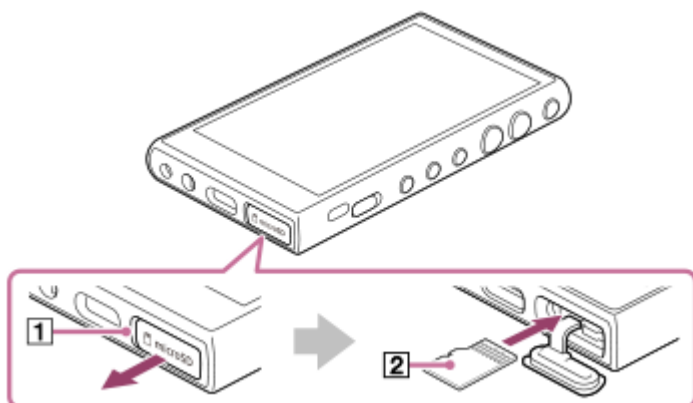
Using a microSD card

This topic includes instructions for the following operations.

- Inserting a microSD card into the player.
- Formatting a microSD card on the player.
To use a microSD card on the player, you first need to format the microSD card on the player.
- Removing a microSD card from the player.

1 Insert a microSD card.

Open the microSD card slot cover (1).
Insert a microSD card (2) until it clicks into place.
Make sure to insert the microSD card in the correct direction.
The gold contact pins should face up.
Close the cover (1).



2 Format the microSD card.

Swipe the Home screen upwards.
Tap the menu items in the following order.
⚙ [Settings] – [Storage].
Tap the name of the microSD card.
Tap the menu items in the following order.
⋮ (options) – [Storage settings] – [Format].
Follow the onscreen instructions to complete formatting.

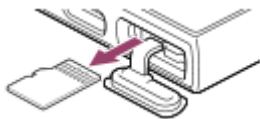
To remove the microSD card

Before you remove a microSD card from the player, first unmount the microSD card from the player.

1. Swipe the Home screen upwards.
2. Tap the menu items in the following order.
⚙ [Settings] – [Storage].
3. Tap the eject icon to the right side of the microSD card name.
4. Open the microSD card slot cover.
Push the microSD card into the microSD card slot.

The microSD card will pop out.

5. Remove the microSD card. Then, close the microSD card slot cover.



Note

- If the player does not recognize the microSD card, remove and reinsert the microSD card into the player.
- Do not insert any object other than a microSD card into the microSD card slot.
- If the inserted microSD card contains a large amount of data, it may take about 10 minutes or longer for “Music player” to build the database.
- When you remove the microSD card, the following information will be deleted.
 - The content that is currently being played.
 - The playback position.
 - Tracks and the playback order on the play queue screen.
- When you remove the microSD card, the following information will disappear.
 - Favorite information for tracks on the microSD card.
 - Bookmark information for tracks on the microSD card.
- Formatting a microSD card will delete all data stored on the microSD card. Save a backup of important data.

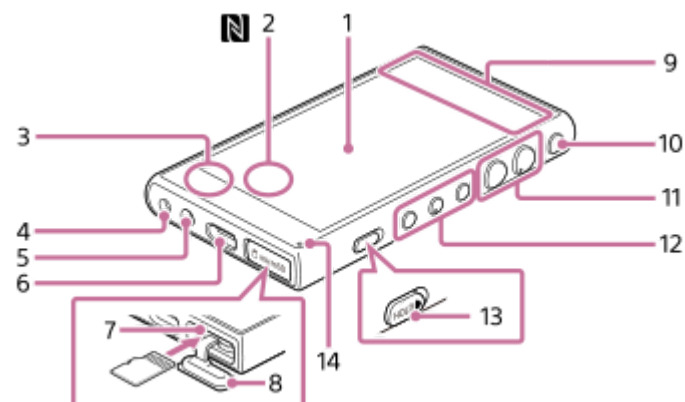
- Use a microSD card that has been formatted on the player. Sony does not guarantee the operation of other microSD cards.
- Sony does not guarantee all operations for microSD cards that are used on multiple devices.
- Formatting a microSD card will delete all data stored on the microSD card. Save a backup copy in advance.
- Do not leave a microSD card within the reach of small children. Small children may accidentally swallow the microSD card.
- Unmount the microSD card from the player before you remove a microSD card. Otherwise, the player may not function properly.
- Sony does not guarantee the operation of all types of compatible microSD cards with the player.
- Data may be corrupted in the following situations.
 - When a microSD card is removed during a read or write operation.
 - When the player is turned off during a read or write operation.
 - When a microSD card is used in a location where there is static electricity or electrical noise.
- Sony assumes no responsibility for any loss or damage of stored data. Sony recommends that you save a backup copy of important data regularly.
- Observe the following cautions when you handle microSD cards.
 - Do not apply strong force to a microSD card.
 - Do not bend a microSD card.
 - Do not drop a microSD card.
 - Do not disassemble a microSD card.
 - Do not modify a microSD card.
 - Do not expose a microSD card to water.
 - Do not leave a microSD card in the hot interior of a car.
 - Do not leave a microSD card in direct sunlight.
 - Do not leave a microSD card near a heater.
 - Do not leave a microSD card in a humid place.
 - Do not leave a microSD card in a location where corrosive substances are present.
 - Do not attach labels.
- Observe the following cautions regarding the microSD card slot.
 - Insert the microSD card straight in the correct direction.
 - Do not insert any object other than a microSD card into the microSD card slot.

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Parts and controls



1. Touch screen
Tap icons or items on the screen to operate the player.
2. N-Mark (back side)
Touch the N-Mark on a Bluetooth device to this mark.
The Bluetooth device (such as headphones or a speaker) must support the NFC function.
You can connect the Bluetooth device to the player.
3. Built-in microphone
You can use the built-in microphone to input sound. Do not cover the microphone while you use it.
4. Headphone jack (Stereo Mini)
Push in the headphone plug until it clicks into place.
Connect the headphones properly. Otherwise, the output sound will be impaired.
5. Strap hole
Attach a strap (not supplied).
6. USB Type-C port
Connect the USB Type-C cable (supplied).
7. microSD card slot (The card slot is inside the slot cover.)
Insert a microSD card (not supplied) until it clicks into place.
8. microSD card slot cover
Open the cover to insert a microSD card.
9. Built-in antenna
The Wi-Fi antenna and Bluetooth antenna are built in. Do not cover the antennas while you use them.
10.  (power) button
 - Press the button to turn the screen on or off.
 - Hold down the button for 5 seconds to turn on the player.
 - Hold down the button for 2 seconds to turn off or restart the player.
 - If operations become unstable, hold down the button for 10 seconds to force the player to restart.
11. +(*1)/– (volume) buttons
Press the buttons to adjust the volume.

12. Playback operating buttons

▶|| (play/pause) (*1): Press the button to start or pause playback.

◀◀ (previous track)/▶▶ (next track): Press the buttons to jump to the beginning of the current track, previous track, or next track.

Hold down the buttons to fast-rewind or to fast-forward playback.

13. HOLD (hold) switch

Slide the switch to lock the playback operating buttons and +/– (volume) buttons on the player. You can avoid operating the buttons accidentally.

14. Charge lamp

The lamp lights up while the player is charging.

*1 There are tactile dots on the ▶|| (play/pause) button and the + (volume) button. The tactile dots can help you operate the buttons without looking at them.

Home screen

Widgets, shortcuts, folders, and more are displayed on the Home screen.



1. Status bar

The status of the player and notifications appear as icons.

Swipe down on the status bar to display the notification panel and the Quick Settings panel.

2. Google search widget

Tap the input field to show the keyboard. Enter text to search on Google.

3. Shortcuts to apps

Tap a shortcut to launch an app.

4. Dock

You can add up to 5 shortcuts for apps.

5. Navigation bar

The navigation bar contains the following 3 buttons. Tap to operate them.

- **(back)**

Tap the button to return to the previous screen.

- **(home)**

Tap the button to display the Home screen.

- **(overview)**

Tap the button to display recently used apps.





Preinstalled apps

Apps such as the following are preinstalled on the player.

- **[Music player]**

Use the app to play music content stored on the player. Prepare music content in the following ways.

- Transferring music content from your computer to the player.
- Purchasing music content from online music services.

-  **[Sound adjustment]**
Use the app to adjust the sound. You can directly adjust the sound for the player. This is useful when you play content using apps other than “Music player”.
-  **[NC/Ambient sound settings]**
Use the app to control the Noise canceling function and Ambient sound mode.
-  **[Play Store]**
Use the app to purchase and/or download various apps from Google Play Store.
-  **[Chrome]**
Use the app to launch Google Chrome and view websites.

How to use the various screens of “Music player”

This topic explains the layout of the various screens of “Music player” with the playback screen (A) at the center. Click the playback screen (A) to switch to other screens (upwards/downwards/to the left/to the right).



(A) Playback screen

You can confirm a variety of information for the currently selected track.

(B) Library screen

You can select tracks from the library screen. Tracks are classified into various categories (such as [All songs], [Album], [Artist], etc.).

C Play queue screen

You can check the list of tracks that the player will play with the current settings.

D Favorites/Bookmarks screen

You can listen to tracks that you have added to Favorites or Bookmarks beforehand.

The following operations can be performed from this screen.

- Adding tracks to Bookmarks.
- Removing tracks from Favorites or Bookmarks.
- Changing the order of tracks in Favorites or Bookmarks.

E Sound adjustment screens

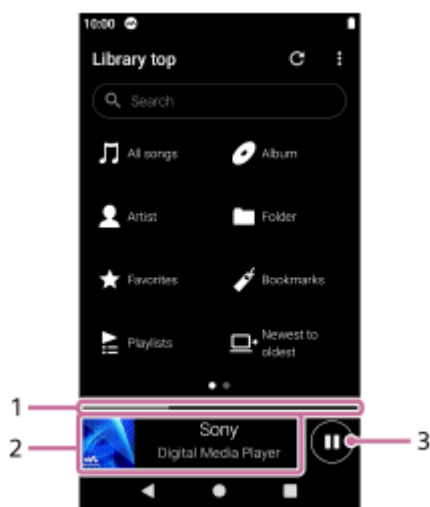
You can use the various sound adjustments.

You can save sound settings as presets. Up to 3 presets can be stored.

- Equalizer
- DSEE Ultimate™
- DC Phase Linearizer
- Dynamic Normalizer
- Vinyl Processor

Mini player

The mini player appears at the bottom of each screen (except for the playback screen). Tap the mini player to display the playback screen.



1. Current playback position

The area indicates the playback position within the current track.

2. Cover art/Track title/Artist name

Tap the area to display the playback screen. Flick the area to the left or right to jump to the beginning of the previous track or next track.

3. ▶ (Play)/⏸ (Pause) button

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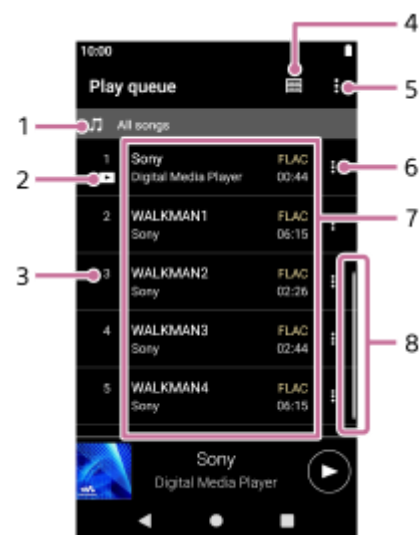

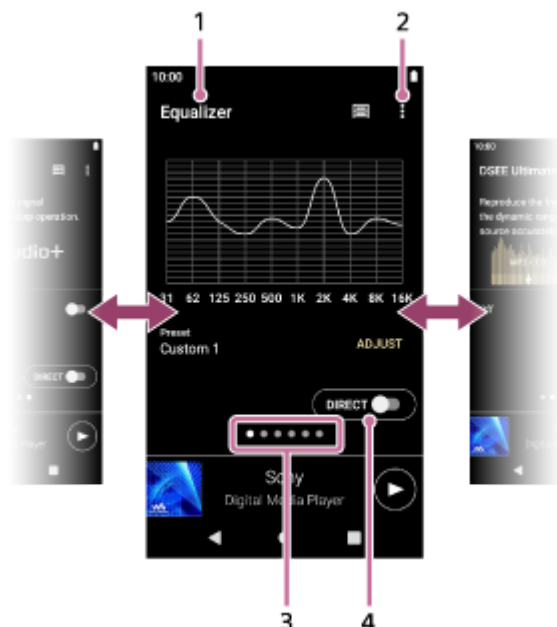

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Setting the screen lock

Open [File Explorer] from the [Start] menu. Select [WALKMAN] from the left pane.
- Windows 8.1:
Open [File Explorer] from [Desktop]. Select [WALKMAN] from the list under [This PC].

4 Open the [Music] folder in [Internal shared storage].

You can also transfer music content to a microSD card.
Select the folder with the name of the microSD card instead of [Internal shared storage].

5 Drag-and-drop the files or folders on the computer to the [Music] folder.

Confirm that the transfer is complete. Then, disconnect the player from the computer.

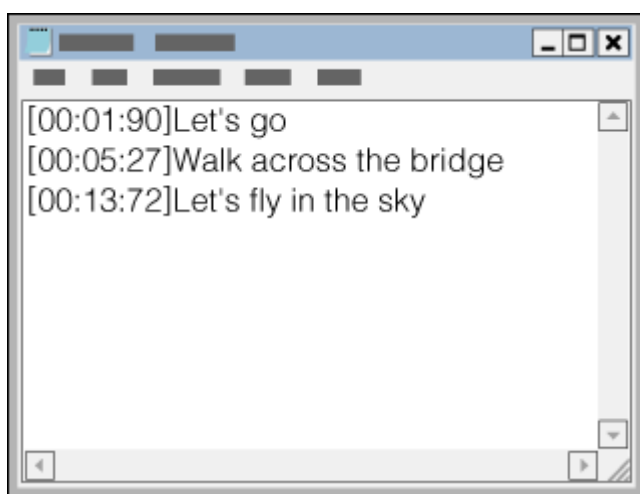
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Adding lyric information using a computer

You can input lyrics to a text file (an LRC file). Transfer both the text file (LRC file) and the music file to the player.

Creating lyrics in a text file (LRC file)

1. Open the [Notepad] in Windows Accessories.
2. Enter the lyrics into [Notepad].
3. Play the track and enter the time to display each line of text.



- You can enter the time information to the left of each line of text in the following format.
Minutes:seconds:hundredths of a second (*1)
- Time information must be entered in chronological order.
- You can separate seconds and hundredths of a second using a period instead of a colon.

*1 You can omit hundredths of a second.

4. Save the file.

- Select [UTF-8] as the character encoding.
- Set the same file name as the music file.
- Set [.lrc] as the extension.
- The maximum file size is 512 KB.
- If a text line cannot fit on the screen, it will be wrapped.
- The number of lines of text that can be displayed simultaneously depends on the model.
- CR, CRLF, and LF line breaks are all recognized.
- Blank text lines will be skipped.

5. Connect the player to the computer via USB.

6. Open the [WALKMAN] folder according to one of the following procedures.

- Windows 10:
Open [File Explorer] from the [Start] menu. Select [WALKMAN] from the left pane.
- Windows 8.1:
Open [File Explorer] from [Desktop]. Select [WALKMAN] from the list under [This PC].

7. Create a new folder in the [Music] folder under [Internal shared storage]. Then, drag-and-drop both the music file and the LRC file into the new folder to transfer them.

You can also transfer music files to a microSD card.

Select the folder with the name of the microSD card instead of [Internal shared storage].

Hint

- The following numbers of characters are recommended when you display lyrics on "Music player".
 - Single-byte characters (for example, alphanumeric characters): 40 characters per line.
 - 2-byte characters (for example, Chinese characters): 20 characters per line.
- Save the LRC files in the same folder as the music files. The LRC files will be transferred to the player when the music files are transferred.
- On a Mac computer, you can create lyrics using "TextEdit" and other text editors. Follow the same procedure as that described above to enter the lyrics or time information in the "Plain text" setting.

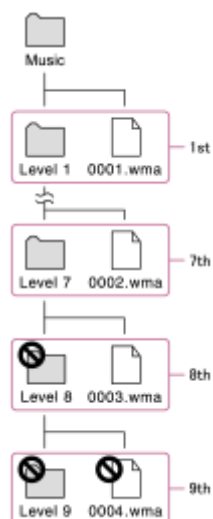

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Notes on Wi-Fi connections

- Local regulations may restrict the use of Wi-Fi devices in some countries or regions.
- Wi-Fi devices work on the 2.4 GHz and 5 GHz bands. Various devices use these bands. Wi-Fi devices use technology to minimize radio interference from other devices on the same band. However, radio interference may cause the following effects.
 - Slower data transfer rates
 - Smaller communication range
 - Communication failure
- If you enable both the Wi-Fi function and the Bluetooth function on the player, slower data transfer rates or other problems may occur.
- To perform Wi-Fi communications outdoors, you may need to contract with a Wi-Fi service provider.
- The data transfer rate and communication range may vary depending on the following conditions.
 - Distance between devices
 - Obstructions between devices
 - Device configuration
 - Signal conditions
 - Surrounding environment (wall material, etc.)
 - Software in use
- Communications may cut off depending on signal conditions.
- The data transfer rate is the theoretical maximum. It does not indicate the actual data transfer rate.
- Wi-Fi devices work on the 2.4 GHz and 5 GHz frequency bands. These frequency bands cannot communicate with each other.
- If the data transfer rate is slow, you may be able to increase the rate by changing the wireless channel on the access point.
- The Wi-Fi antenna is built into the player. If you cover the antenna with your hands or other objects, the Wi-Fi connection may deteriorate.

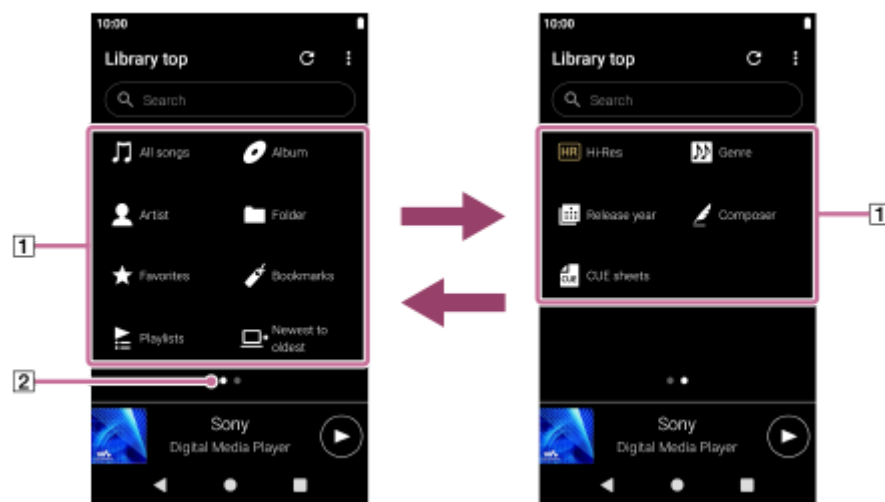

- **Repeat off**

-  **(Repeat all)**
Tracks in the selected range are played repeatedly. (*1)
-  **(Repeat 1 song)**
The current track is played repeatedly.

*1 “Selected range” means one album or one artist, for example.

- When you select a track from Bookmarks, “Music player” plays tracks in the selected Bookmarks only. Tracks in other Bookmarks will not be played even when [Playback range] is set to [All range].
- When you select a track from a playlist, “Music player” plays tracks in the selected playlist only. Tracks in other playlists will not be played even when [Playback range] is set to [All range].

Connecting the player to an unpaired Bluetooth device for the first time

The BLUETOOTH® function enables wireless connections between devices. The devices need to support Bluetooth wireless technology. A wireless connection is possible at a range of up to 10 meters (32.8 feet) in an open area. You can listen to music wirelessly by connecting the player to a Bluetooth device such as headphones or speakers. When you connect Bluetooth devices wirelessly for the first time, the devices must be registered to each other. This registration is called “pairing”. Once the player and the device are paired, you can easily connect the devices in the future. The following instructions are a basic step-by-step procedure for connecting the player and a Bluetooth device.

1 Turn on the Bluetooth function on the Bluetooth device.

2 Swipe the Home screen upwards on the player.

3 Tap the menu items in the following order.

 [Settings] – [Connected devices] – [Pair new device].

A list of the connectable devices will appear on the screen.

4 Tap the Bluetooth device.


If you are required to enter a passkey while pairing, check and enter the passkey for the Bluetooth device. For details on the passkey for the Bluetooth device, refer to the manual of the device.

When the connection is established, the name of the connected device appears under [Connected devices].

To disconnect from a paired Bluetooth device

Swipe the Home screen upwards.

Tap the menu items in the following order.

 [Settings] – [Connected devices].


Tap the settings icon next to the name of the device to disconnect.

Hint

- You can pair the player with only one Bluetooth device at a time. To pair with multiple Bluetooth devices, repeat the procedure in this topic for each device.
- You can erase a registered Bluetooth device. On the list of devices under [Connected devices], tap the settings icon next to the name of the Bluetooth device that you want to erase.
- The passkey may also be called a “passcode”, “PIN code”, “PIN number”, or “password”.
- The player stays connected to the Bluetooth device until you turn off the Bluetooth function. To conserve the battery power, turn off the Bluetooth function or disconnect the player from the paired Bluetooth device.

Note

- Pairing information is deleted in the following situations. Pair the devices again.
 - One or both of the devices are reset to the factory settings.
 - Pairing information is deleted from the devices, such as when the devices are repaired.
- The battery life becomes considerably shorter when the Bluetooth function is active.

- If pairing times out before it is finished, perform the pairing procedure again.
- If sound is interrupted or skips during a Bluetooth connection, try the following.
 - Place the player and the Bluetooth device closer together.
 - Select [SBC-Connection pref.] for [Wireless playback quality].
Swipe the Home screen upwards.
Tap the menu items in the following order.
 [Settings] – [Connected devices] – [Connection preferences] – [Bluetooth] – [Wireless playback quality] – [SBC-Connection pref.].
- A Bluetooth connection is terminated automatically in the following cases:
 - The battery of the player has run out.
 - The player is turned off.
- When there is an active Bluetooth connection, the following sound adjustments are disabled.
 - DSEE Ultimate™
 - DC Phase Linearizer
 - Vinyl Processor

Connecting the player to a paired Bluetooth device

If the player and a Bluetooth device have been paired before, the Bluetooth device is registered to the player. You can connect the player and the Bluetooth device easily.

1 Turn on the Bluetooth function on the Bluetooth device.

2 Swipe the Home screen upwards on the player.

3 Tap the menu items in the following order.

 [Settings] – [Connected devices] – [Connection preferences] – [Bluetooth].

Then, tap the Bluetooth switch to turn on the Bluetooth function.

When the Bluetooth function of the player turns on, the player automatically connects to a paired Bluetooth device. If the player does not connect automatically to a Bluetooth device, or if you want to connect to another paired device, go to the next step.


4 Swipe the Home screen upwards. Then, tap the menu items in the following order.

 [Settings] – [Connected devices] – [Previously connected devices].

5 Tap the settings icon next to the name of the Bluetooth device, and tap [Connect].

To turn the Bluetooth function on or off

Swipe the Home screen upwards. Then, tap the menu items in the following order.

 [Settings] – [Connected devices] – [Connection preferences] – [Bluetooth].

Then, tap the Bluetooth switch to turn the Bluetooth function on or off.

To confirm the information for a Bluetooth device

Tap the settings icon next to the name of the Bluetooth device.

To erase a registered Bluetooth device


Tap the settings icon next to the name of the Bluetooth device and tap [Forget].

Follow the onscreen instructions. The pairing information will be erased.

Hint

- You can also turn the Bluetooth function on or off from the Quick Settings panel. On the Home screen, swipe down on the status bar twice. Then tap the icon for Bluetooth function in the Quick Settings panel.
- If multiple names for a Bluetooth device are displayed, check the BD address of the Bluetooth device. For details on the BD address, refer to the manual of the Bluetooth device.
- If the Bluetooth device supports the NFC function, the player and the Bluetooth device can be paired and connected by touching them together.
- The player stays connected to a Bluetooth device until you turn off the Bluetooth function. To conserve the battery power, turn off the Bluetooth function or terminate the Bluetooth connection with the connected device.

Note

- The battery life becomes considerably shorter when the Bluetooth function is active.
- If sound is interrupted or skips during a Bluetooth connection, try the following.
 - Place the player and the Bluetooth device closer together.
 - Select [SBC-Connection pref.] for [Wireless playback quality].
Swipe the Home screen upwards. Then tap the menu items in the following order.
 [Settings] – [Connected devices] – [Connection preferences] – [Bluetooth] – [Wireless playback quality] – [SBC-Connection pref.].
- A Bluetooth connection is terminated automatically in the following cases:
 - The battery of the player has run out.
 - The player is turned off.
- When there is an active Bluetooth connection, the following sound adjustments are disabled.
 - DSEE Ultimate™
 - DC Phase Linearizer
 - Vinyl Processor

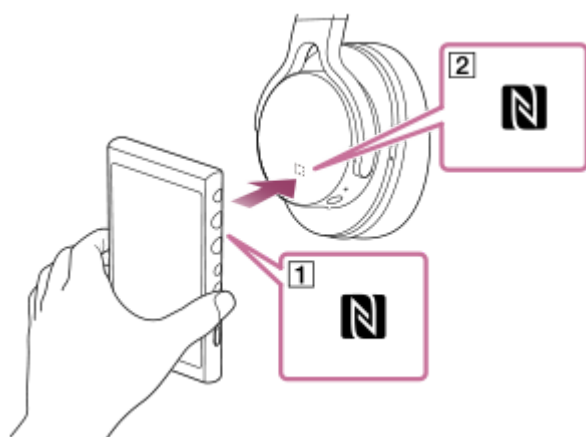
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One-touch connections with a Bluetooth device (NFC)

NFC is for close-range wireless communications.

If a Bluetooth device supports the NFC function, you can connect the player and the device easily. You can simply touch the device to the player to pair the devices and establish a Bluetooth connection.

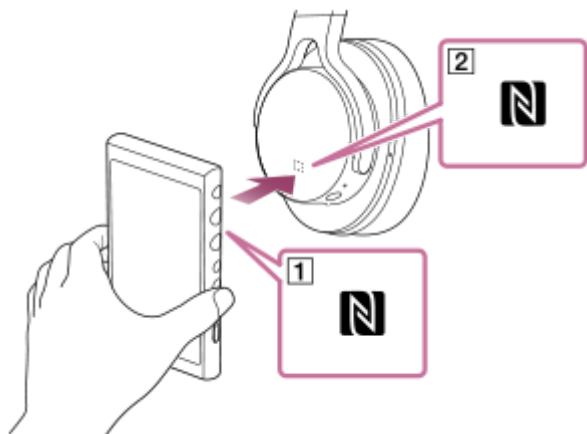
- 1 If the Bluetooth device has an NFC switch, set the NFC switch to on.
- 2 Turn on the screen of the player.
- 3 Touch the mark on the player (1) and the Bluetooth device (2) together.
Hold them together until instructions appear on the screen of the player.



- 4 Follow the onscreen instructions on the player to complete the connection.
- 5 Once the connection is established, play a track on the player.


To disconnect the player and the Bluetooth device using the NFC function

Turn on the screen of the player. Then, touch the player and the Bluetooth device (1 and 2) together again to disconnect.





To turn off the NFC function

The NFC function is turned on as a default. If you want to turn off the NFC function, swipe the Home screen upwards. Then, tap the menu items in the following order.

 [Settings] – [Connected devices] – [Connection preferences].
Then tap the [NFC] switch.

Hint

- Take the following measures if the connection is poor.
 - Move the Bluetooth device over the mark on the player ().
 - If your player is inside a case, take it out of the case.

Notes on the Bluetooth function

In this topic, [Bluetooth devices] refers to all Bluetooth-compatible devices.

Bluetooth-compatible devices are audio devices that support the Bluetooth function.

- Depending on the Bluetooth device, network environment, and surrounding conditions, noise may be heard or the sound may be interrupted. To optimize Bluetooth communications, observe the following.
 - Place the player and the Bluetooth device as close together as possible. The Bluetooth standard supports distances of up to 10 meters (32.8 feet).
 - Turn the built-in Bluetooth antenna (aerial) in the direction of the connected Bluetooth device.
 - Do not block the antenna (aerial) with a metal object such as a bag or case.
 - Do not block the antenna (aerial) with a body part such as a hand.
 - Do not block the antenna (aerial) by placing the player inside a backpack or shoulder bag.
 - Do not block the antenna (aerial) by using the player in a crowded place.
 - Avoid areas where electromagnetic waves are emitted. For example, near microwave ovens, mobile phones, or mobile gaming devices.
- Due to a characteristic of Bluetooth wireless technology, the sound may lag slightly.
- Bluetooth radiation may affect the operation of electronic medical devices.
Turn off the player and other Bluetooth devices in the following locations.
 - in hospitals
 - near priority seats on trains
 - on airplanes
 - in places where flammable gases are present (gas stations, etc.)
 - near automatic doors
 - near fire alarms
- The player supports security functions that comply with the Bluetooth standard. Sony bears no responsibility whatsoever for information leaks that occur as a result of your Bluetooth connection.
- Even if a Bluetooth device conforms to the standard, all connections and correct operations are not guaranteed.
- Depending on the Bluetooth device, it may take some time to establish a Bluetooth connection.

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Adjusting the sound


The player has various settings for adjusting the sound. You can adjust the sound with the following options.

- “Sound adjustment” app.
- The sound adjustment screens in “Music player”.

The following are instructions for using “Sound adjustment” app.

- 1 On the Home screen, tap  [Sound adjustment].
- 2 Flick the screen to the left or right to select the sound adjustment.

You can set the following sound adjustment.

- **Direct Source**
This setting outputs the file’s original sound quality directly without applying any sound effects.
Turn on this function to listen to music without processing the audio signals. This will be effective when you enjoy High-Resolution Audio content. On one of the sound adjustment screens, tap the [DIRECT] switch to turn this function on or off.
- **Equalizer**
You can select an equalizer setting to suit your mood or current activity. Tap [Preset]. Select the desired preset and tap [OK] to apply.
[Custom 1] and [Custom 2] are the user presets. Select [Custom 1] or [Custom 2] and tap [OK] to apply. Then, tap [Adjust] to customize the equalizer setting.
- **DSEE Ultimate™**
This function upscales the sound quality of audio files. The sound quality will become almost equal to that of High-Resolution Audio. The function reproduces the clear high-range sound that is often lost.
This function turns into DSEE HX when using apps other than “Music player”.
- **DC Phase Linearizer**
This function adjusts low-frequency phase shifts to reproduce the audio characteristics of analog amplifiers.
- **Dynamic Normalizer**
You can moderate the change in volume between tracks to minimize differences in volume level.
- **Vinyl Processor**
This function produces rich sound that is close to the playback from a vinyl record on a turntable.
- **ClearAudio+™**
This function automatically applies the recommended sound settings to the output sound.
- **Saved sound settings**
On one of the sound adjustments, tap the menu items in the following order.
 (Options) – [Saved sound settings].
 - Save current settings: You can save customized sound adjustments as your own sound presets.
 - Saved sound settings 1, Saved sound settings 2, Saved sound settings 3: You can retrieve preset sound adjustments.

Hint

- You cannot select sound adjustments if you have turned on the following settings. Turn off the settings to enable the other sound adjustments.
 - Direct Source
 - ClearAudio+
- Both the “Sound adjustment” app and the sound adjustment screens in “Music player” share adjusted values.

Note

- When there is an active Bluetooth connection, the following sound adjustments are disabled.
 - DSEE Ultimate™
 - DC Phase Linearizer
 - Vinyl Processor
- Sound adjustments are disabled when sound is output from a USB audio device that is connected to the USB Type-C port.

1 On the Home screen, tap  [NC/Ambient sound settings].

2 Turn on the Noise canceling function.


Tap the [Noise canceling] switch to turn on the function.

 will appear in the status bar.


3 Configure the settings for the Noise canceling function, if necessary.

- [Select environment]:
You can select a type of noise cancelation to match the current environment. [Full-auto AINC] automatically sets the most effective Noise canceling mode.
- [Adjust noise canceling]:
You can adjust the Noise canceling effect. Adjust the effect using the slider.

To turn off the Noise canceling function

On the Home screen, tap  [NC/Ambient sound settings] to launch the app. Then, tap the [Noise canceling] switch to turn off the function.

Hint

- You can also turn the Noise canceling function on or off from the Quick Settings panel. On the Home screen, swipe down on the status bar twice. Then, tap the icon for the Noise canceling function in the Quick Settings panel.
- The sound may skip when you listen to the player on public transportation. This is caused by the Noise canceling system and is not a malfunction. You may be able to reduce sound skipping by calibrating [Adjust noise canceling] in the  [NC/Ambient sound settings] app.

Note

- Use headphones that are compatible with the Noise canceling function. Otherwise, the Noise canceling function will not work.
- Select an appropriate earbud size to enjoy the full effects of the Noise canceling function.
- You may hear rubbing noises while wearing headphones. This is not a malfunction.
- The Noise canceling function mainly reduces noise in low frequency bands. This function does not cancel all noise.
- Do not cover the microphone part of the headphones.
- When the Noise canceling function is operating correctly, you may hear a slight hissing noise. This is not a malfunction.
- Keep the player away from mobile phones or smartphones. These devices may cause noise.
- Turn off the Noise canceling function in quiet places where the Noise canceling may not be effective.

- Remove headphones from your ears before you connect them to the player. Also remove the headphones from your ears before you disconnect them from the player. Large noise may be generated when the headphones are connected or disconnected.
- You may hear noise when you turn the Noise canceling function on or off. This is not a malfunction.
- The Noise canceling function is disabled while the following function is active.
 - Ambient sound mode

What is Ambient sound mode?

Ambient sound mode uses the microphones built into the headphones that support Ambient sound mode to allow you to hear ambient sound even while wearing headphones. Pay attention to the sounds around you to enjoy listening to music safely.

Note

- Ambient sound mode allows you to hear ambient sound even while wearing headphones. However, note that this mode does not enable you to hear all sounds around you. Ambient sound may not be heard well depending on the surrounding environment, type of the music being played on the player, or the volume level. Be very careful when using the headphones in places where an inability to hear ambient sound would be dangerous (such as on roads where there is car or bicycle traffic).
- Ambient sound mode may not function properly if you use the headphones with earbuds that do not fit your ears. Use earbuds of an appropriate size to fit your ears comfortably and snugly.

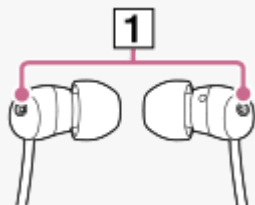

- Depending on the surrounding environment or the volume of the ambient sounds, Ambient sound mode may turn off temporarily. This is not a malfunction. Adjust [Ambient sound level]. It may solve the problem.
- When you disconnect the headphones from the player, turn off Ambient sound mode beforehand.
- If you cannot hear the ambient sounds well, try changing [Ambient sound level]. This setting may improve the level of the ambient sounds.
- Depending on the surrounding environment, a rubbing noise may be noticeable. (Rubbing noise refers to a noise generated when the headphone cable rubs against clothing or when hair rubs against the headphones, etc.) In this case, adjust [Ambient sound level]. The rubbing noise may be reduced.

- Ambient sound mode is disabled while the following function is active.
 - The Noise canceling function

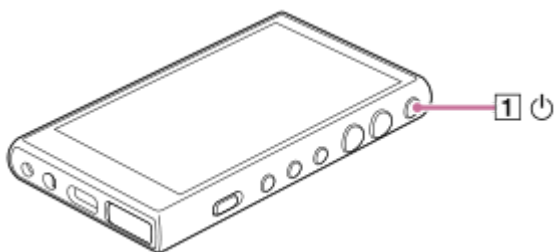
