## About the App Required to Use the Speaker System

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Use a smartphone with the “Sony | BRAVIA Connect” app installed to perform initial setup (including installation and connection) and operations as well as configure the settings on the speaker system.

Be sure to use the app to install and set up, even when connecting optional speakers.

If you are already using an app-compatible device, select [Add device] for installation and setup after updating the app to the latest version.



An Internet connection is required to use the speaker system.

To use the speaker system, connect the smartphone on which the app is installed to the same network as the speaker system.

The app allows you to perform the following operations and setup.

- Proper installation and connection of the speaker system and optional speakers connected to the speaker system
- Initial setup of the speaker system, including network connection, surround sound optimization, etc.
- Operations such as volume adjustment, input selection, etc.
- Change the settings of the speaker system to the desired settings
- Update the software of the speaker system to the latest version
- Check the support information and latest update information

The supplied remote control can only be used to perform operations and change settings that are frequently used when you view content.

### Note

- An account and sign-in are required to use the app.
- If you do not use the app or the speaker system for more than 30 days, you may need to re-register the speaker system on the app.

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## About the Help Guide Description

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### About the description of operations

This Help Guide explains operations based on the following assumptions.

- Both the speaker system and the “Sony | BRAVIA Connect” app have the latest version of software.
- The speaker system is connected to a TV that is compatible with eARC or ARC using an HDMI cable, and the Control for HDMI functions of the speaker system and TV are enabled.
- The setup of the speaker system and TV(\*) has been completed on following the screen on the “Sony | BRAVIA Connect” app.
  - \* If you are using an app-compatible BRAVIA, both the speaker system and BRAVIA can be controlled with the remote control screen on the app. If you are using other TVs, only the speaker system can be controlled with the remote control screen on the app.

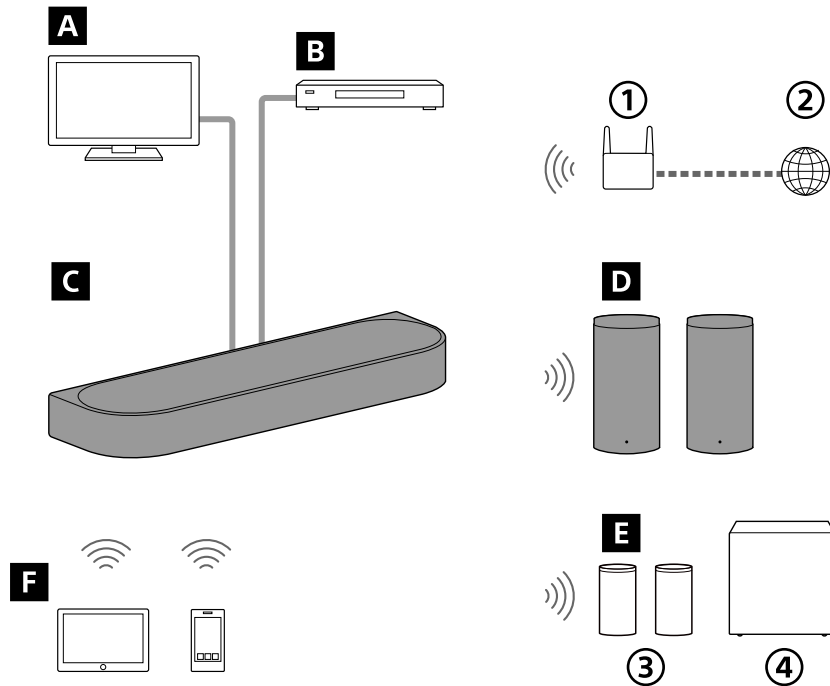

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## System Configuration of the Speaker System and Connected Devices

The speaker system supports object-based audio formats such as Dolby Atmos and DTS:X.

### **A** TV

The speaker system can be used to play TV sound by connecting the center speaker and TV that is compatible with eARC or ARC using an HDMI cable.

The speaker system can be used to play AV device sound by connecting the center speaker and AV device using an HDMI cable.

You can enjoy sound through the center speaker and supplied front speakers by connecting a TV and AV device to the center speaker.

### **D** Supplied front speakers

Connects wirelessly to the center speaker to output the sound.

By using the app, optional rear speakers and subwoofers can be connected with the speaker system and configured. The model names of the main audio devices that are compatible with the speaker system can be found at the following URL.

## **F** Mobile device

The speaker system can be used to play mobile device sound by connecting the speaker system and mobile device using the BLUETOOTH function.

The speaker system can also be used to stream music by connecting a mobile device to the same network as the speaker system.

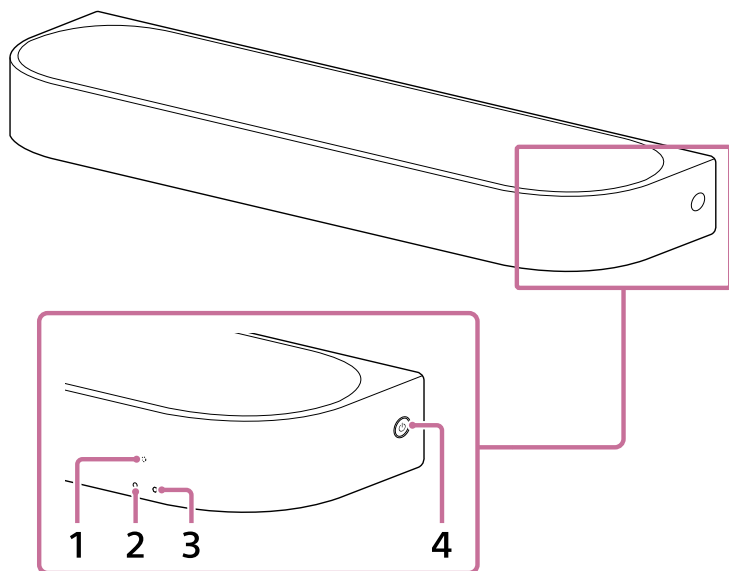

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## Center Speaker

### Front



#### 1. Remote control sensor

Point the supplied remote control at the remote control sensor of the center speaker to operate the speaker system.

#### 2. Sub status indicator (white)

Indicates the speaker system status by lighting or flashing in white.

#### 3. Main status indicator (colored)

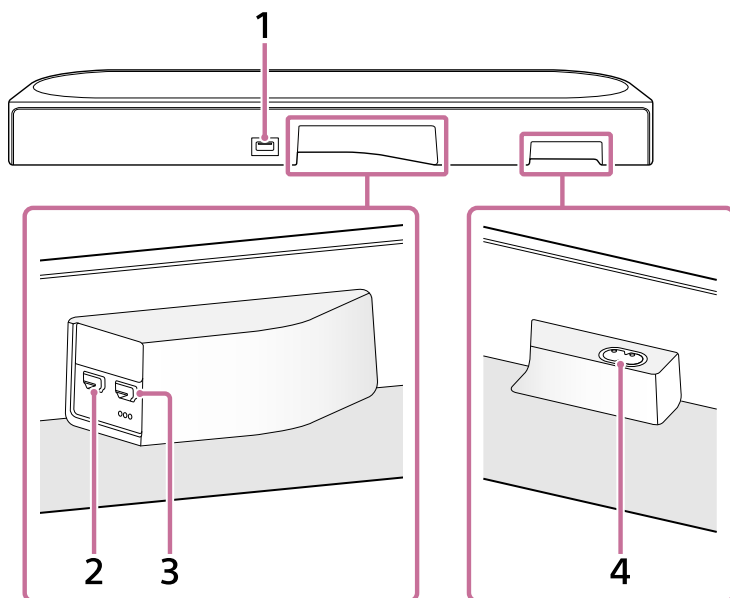
Indicates the speaker system status by lighting or flashing in 5 colors (white/light blue/blue/green/red).

#### 4. (Power)

Turns on the speaker system. If you press this button when the speaker system is turned on, the speaker system is set to standby mode.

Press and hold this button for more than 10 seconds to reset the speaker system.

### Rear



#### 1. FOR SERVICE port

#### 2. HDMI IN jack

#### 3. HDMI OUT (TV (eARC/ARC)) jack

This is an HDMI jack dedicated for connection to a TV.

Use an HDMI cable to connect a TV that has an HDMI input jack. The speaker system is compatible with eARC and ARC. ARC is a feature that sends TV sound from the HDMI jack on the TV to an AV device such as the speaker system via an HDMI cable. eARC is an advanced version of ARC that enables transmission of object-based audio and multi-channel LPCM content that cannot be transmitted with ARC.

#### 4. AC inlet

##### Hint

- There are three tactile dots that are about 1 mm (1/16 in) in size under the HDMI OUT (TV (eARC/ARC)) jack. Use them as a guide during connection.

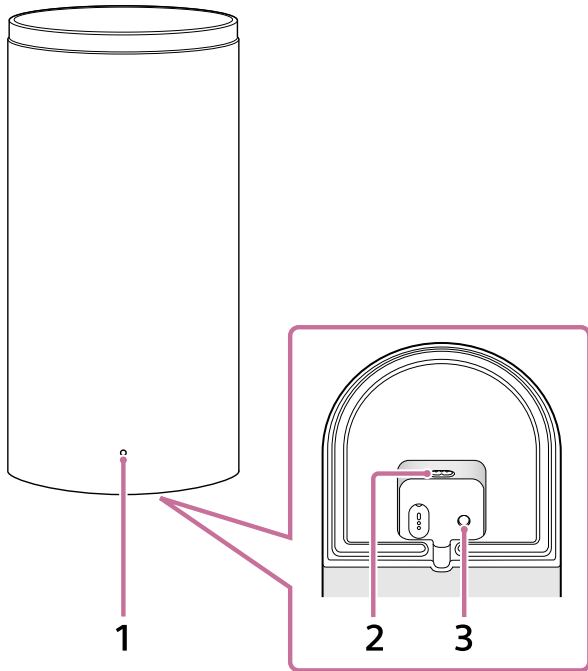

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## Front Speaker

### Front, Bottom



#### 1. Power indicator

Indicates the front speaker status by lighting or flashing in 3 colors (white/blue/red).

#### 2. AC inlet

#### 3. LINK

The function of the button varies depending on how long it is pressed.

When the front speaker is turned on:

- **Press:** Press this button when the center speaker and front speakers do not connect properly with the “Sony | BRAVIA Connect” app. Follow the instructions on the app.
- **Press and hold for 2 seconds until the notification sound plays:** Turns off the front speaker.
- **Press and hold for more than 10 seconds until the second notification sound plays:** Resets the front speaker.

When the front speaker is turned off:

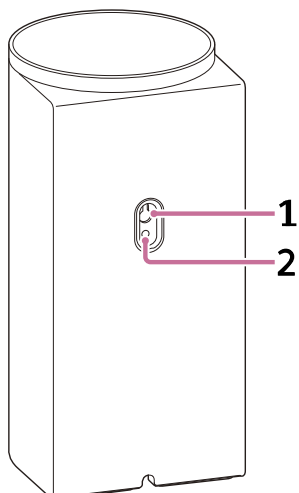
- **Press:** Turns on the front speaker.

#### Hint

- The indented area on the bottom of the left front speaker (FRONT L) has a convex bar approximately 5 mm (13/64 in) in size and two tactile dots approximately 1 mm (1/16 in) in size lined up side by side. The indented area on the bottom of the right front speaker (FRONT R) has a convex bar approximately 5 mm (13/64 in) in size. The convex bar indicates that it is a front speaker. Use it as a guide to distinguish it from the optional rear speaker. Use the tactile dots as a guide to distinguish the left front speaker from the right front speaker.

## Rear

The illustration below shows the front speaker with the cover on the rear removed.



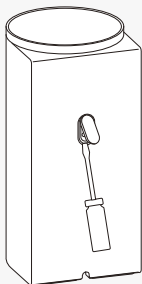
### 1. Wall mounting hole

- When using the wall mounting hole (1) or mounting hole for the general speaker stand (2), remove the cover by inserting a flathead screwdriver, etc.



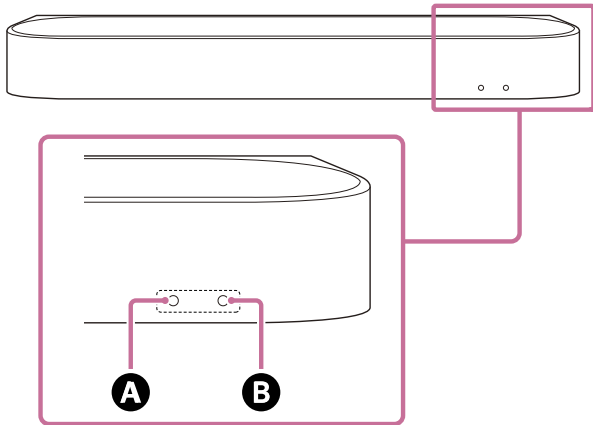

There are two indicators that indicate the status of the center speaker.  
The sub status indicator (white) is on the left and the main status indicator (colored) is on the right.

- B** Main status indicator (colored)









### Power status






#### **B** Main status indicator

- ..... (Turned off)  
The center speaker is turned off.
-  .....  ..... (Flashing slowly in white)  
Power on/off is processing.



### Audio input/muting

#### **B** Main status indicator

-  (Lit up in white)  
TV (eARC/ARC) input is selected.
-  (Lit up in green)  
HDMI input is selected.
-  (Lit up in blue)  
BLUETOOTH input is selected.  
A BLUETOOTH device is connected to the speaker system.
-  .....  ..... (Flashing twice repeatedly in blue)  
The speaker system is in BLUETOOTH pairing standby status.
-  .....  ..... (Flashing in blue)  
The connection with the BLUETOOTH device is in progress.
-  (Lit up in light blue)  
Network service input is selected.





-  (Flashing twice in white)  
Switching to TV (eARC/ARC) input is in progress.
-  (Flashing twice in green)  
Switching to HDMI input is in progress.
-  (Flashing twice in blue)  
Switching to BLUETOOTH input is in progress.
-  (Flashing twice in light blue)  
Switching to network service input is in progress.
-  (Flashing slowly in white/blue alternately)  
The speaker system is being set up. Audio playback is not available.

### **A Sub status indicator**

-  (Flashing slowly in white)  
Initial setup is not complete on the app or the speaker system is not connected to a network.
-  (Flashing every 2 seconds in white)  
The speaker system is muted.




## **Setup/operation feedback**

### **A Sub status indicator**

-  (Lit up once for a longer time in white)  
The setting is switched to on.
-  (Flashing twice in white)  
The setting is switched to off.
-  (Lit up once briefly in white)  
The volume is going up and down.
-  (Flashing three times in white)  
Operation is invalid. For example, setting cannot be changed, volume is at upper or lower limit, etc.

## **Special conditions**

### **B Main status indicator**

-  (Flashing quickly in blue)  
The speaker system is being registered on the app.
-  (Flashing in white/blue alternately)  
Software updating/resetting, etc. is in progress.
-  (Flashing in red)  
An abnormality or error has been detected. Follow the steps in “[Troubleshooting](#).”

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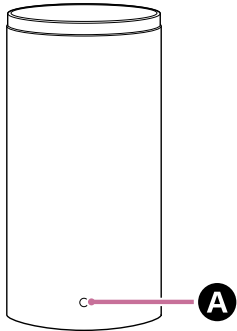



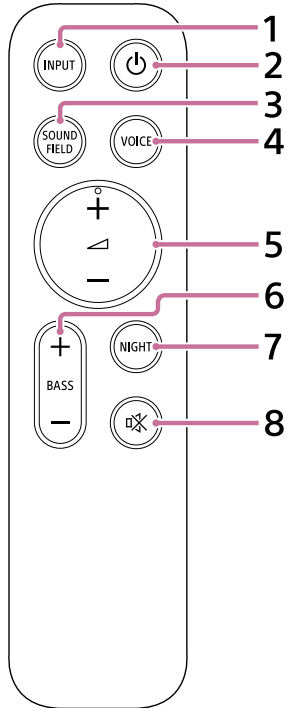

## Supplied Remote Control



### 1. INPUT (Input)

When this button is pressed, the indicator for the selected input flashes. Press this button repeatedly to switch from the current input to the input you want to select.

The input source switches as follows.

TV ➡ HDMI ➡ BLUETOOTH ➡ Network service (Spotify<sup>\*</sup>/AirPlay<sup>\*\*</sup>) ➡ TV . . .

<sup>\*</sup> The Spotify service may not be available in some countries/regions.

<sup>\*\*</sup> Displayed only when the input is switched by pressing the button during music playback on Spotify/AirPlay.

### 2. ⏻ (Power)

Switches between power on and standby on the speaker system.

### 3. SOUND FIELD (Sound field)

Turns on/off the surround sound effect on the speaker system.

### 4. VOICE (Voice mode)

Turns on/off the voice mode on the speaker system.

When a Sony TV compatible with the linkage function of the speaker system is connected, the voice zoom is turned on/off instead of the voice mode by selecting TV input on the speaker system.

### 5. ▲ (Volume) + (plus)<sup>\*\*\*</sup>/- (minus)

Used to adjust the volume of the speaker system.

<sup>\*\*\*</sup> ▲ (Volume) + (plus) has a tactile dot. Use it as a guide during operation.

### 6. BASS (Bass level) + (plus)/- (minus)

Used to adjust the volume of the bass sound or optional subwoofer.

### 7. NIGHT (Night mode)

Turns on/off the night mode on the speaker system.

## 8. (Muting)

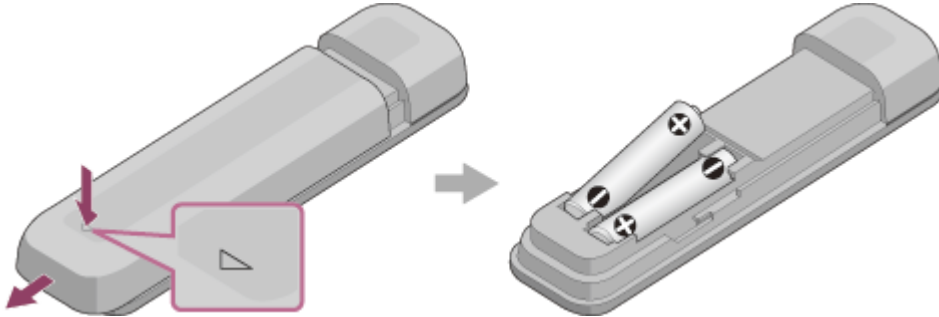
Temporarily turns off the sound on the speaker system.

### About the replacement of batteries for the supplied remote control

If the speaker system does not respond when operating with the supplied remote control, replace the two batteries with new batteries.

Use R03 or LR03 (size AAA) batteries for replacement.

To remove the battery cover, slide it off while pressing the triangular mark on the back of the remote control.



### If the remote control does not work properly

- Point the remote control at the remote control sensor on the center speaker.
- Remove any obstructions between the remote control and the center speaker.
- Check that the + (positive) and - (negative) of the battery are in the correct orientation.
- Replace both batteries in the remote control with new ones if they are older batteries.
- Check that the correct button on the remote control is being pressed.

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## Remote Control Screen on the App

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There are two types of remote control screens on the app.

### Remote control screen that can only operate the speaker system


This screen is displayed when a TV that is not compatible with the app is connected using the HDMI cable.

### Remote control screen that can operate the speaker system and BRAVIA

This screen is displayed when an app-compatible BRAVIA is connected using the HDMI cable.

The following items that can be used to operate the speaker system are displayed in [Remote], [Picture & Sound], [Audio output], and [Settings]. If the TV is not turned on, a remote control screen that can only operate the speaker system will appear.

#### Items on the remote control screen on the app

- **[Remaining Battery Level]** (When connecting to the optional built-in rechargeable rear speakers)  
The remaining charge level of the built-in rechargeable battery for the optional rear speakers is displayed.
  - **Playback information/input switching area**  
The currently selected input, etc. appears on the upper part of the screen. The following information and operations are displayed by tapping this area.
    - Playback meta information: Name, artist, album, length, etc. of the song that is currently playing.
    - Stream Info: Input signal frequency, etc.
    - Audio format: Audio format of input signal (Dolby Atmos, DTS, etc.), number of channels, etc.
    - Name of the BLUETOOTH device connected to the speaker system
    - Playback controls for the BLUETOOTH device
    - Input selection(\*)
- \* When a TV compatible with the app is connected to the speaker system using an HDMI cable, TV input can also be selected.
- **[  (Power) ]**  
Sets the speaker system to standby mode when this is tapped while the speaker system is turned on.
  - **[Night mode]**  
Turns on/off the night mode on the speaker system.
  - **[Sound field]**  
Turns on/off the surround sound effect on the speaker system.
  - **[Voice mode]**  
Turns on/off the voice mode on the speaker system.
  - **[Voice Zoom]**  
This function is enabled when a Sony TV compatible with the linkage function of the speaker system is connected. When TV input is selected on the speaker system, the voice zoom works instead of the voice mode.
  - **[Volume]**  
Used to adjust the volume of the speaker system.
  - **[Rear level]** (When connecting to the optional rear speakers)  
Used to adjust the volume of the rear speakers.

- **[Bass level]**

Used to adjust the volume of the bass sound or optional subwoofer.

- **[Audio]**

When a dual audio (dual mono) signal is input to the speaker system, the audio you want to hear can be selected.

**Note**

- The speaker system cannot switch bilingual broadcasts with multiple signals and the main/sub channels of multiplex broadcasts. Switch the audio signal on sender units such as TVs or Blu-ray Disc players. For details, refer to the operating instructions supplied with the TV or Blu-ray Disc players.

- **[Viewing Position]**

The sound field can be optimized according to the viewing position. This function cannot be used if the viewing position is not measured accurately by the initial setup or [Sound Field Optimization](\*\*).

\*\* Displayed when you tap [Settings] - [Sound Settings] - [Sound Field Optimization] on the remote control screen on the app.

- **[Settings]**

Used to configure the settings of the speaker system.

**Note**

- If the control response is poor, check the Wi-Fi connection between the smartphone and the speaker system.

The center speaker and front speakers can be installed on a TV stand or shelves, or mounted on a wall.

### Example of the speakers installed on a TV stand and shelves:

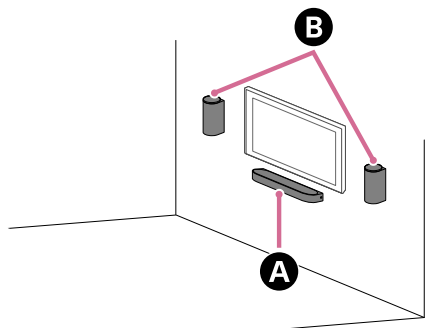

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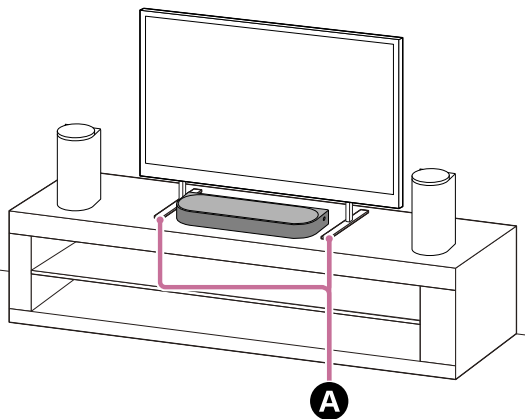
## Installing the Center Speaker and Front Speakers on a TV Stand and Shelves

### 1 Install the center speaker on a TV stand and shelves, taking the following points into consideration.

- Install the center speaker in an empty space in front of the TV.
- Align the center of the TV with the center of the center speaker.
- Ensure the top of the center speaker does not overlap the TV and does not hide the TV screen or the remote control sensor on the TV.

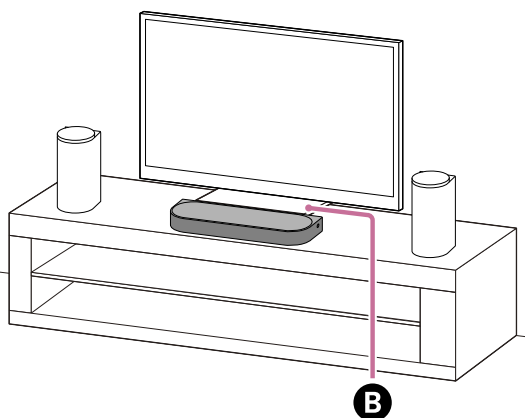
If the center speaker cannot be placed properly due to interference with the legs of the TV, see [“How to deal with the case where the center speaker cannot be placed properly due to interference of the TV legs.”](#)

### 2 Check the labels on the bottom of the front speakers to identify the left and right front speakers.

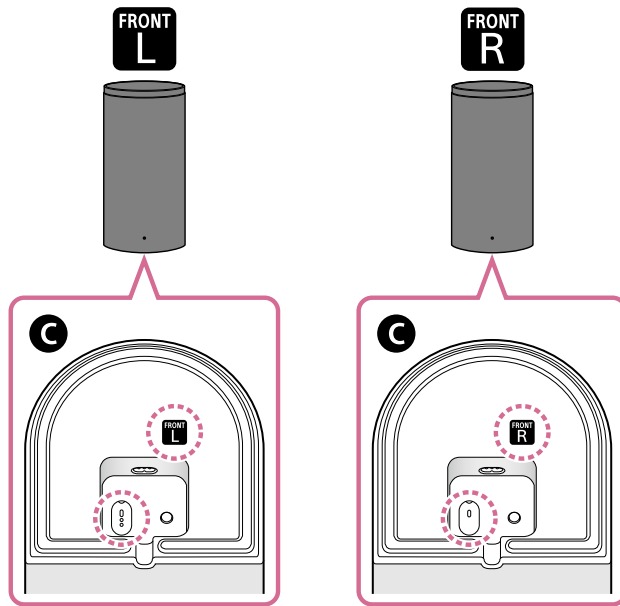
The left front speaker is labeled “FRONT L” and the right front speaker is labeled “FRONT R.”

The indented area on the bottom of the left front speaker (FRONT L) has a convex bar approximately 5 mm (13/64 in) in size and two tactile dots approximately 1 mm (1/16 in) in size lined up side by side.

The indented area on the bottom of the right front speaker (FRONT R) has a convex bar approximately 5 mm (13/64

in) in size.

The convex bar indicates that it is a front speaker. Use it as a guide to distinguish it from the optional rear speaker. Use the tactile dots as a guide to distinguish the left front speaker from the right front speaker.

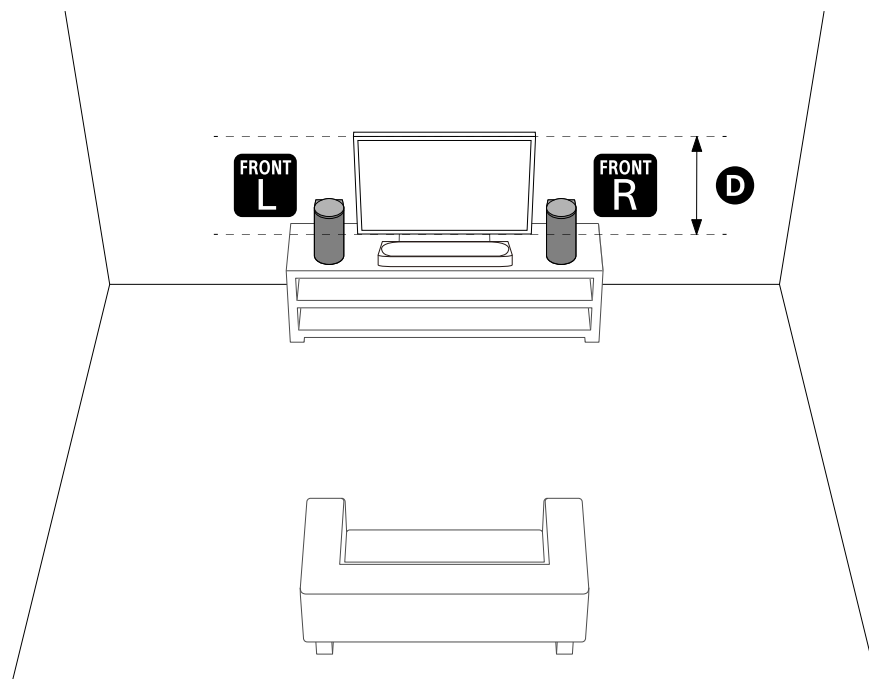


### C Bottom of the front speaker

## 3 Install the left and right front speakers on either side of the TV, positioned in front of the viewing area.

By considering the following points during installation, you can more effectively experience better sound quality.

- Align the front speakers so they face the same direction as the center speaker.
- Install the front speakers so that some or all of them overlap within the height range of the TV screen.

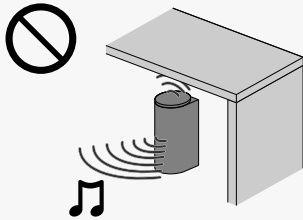


### D Height range of the TV screen

#### Note

- Do not place metal objects near the center speaker and front speakers. Wireless functions may become unstable.
- Do not place anything on the sides of the center speaker that may obstruct the sound. Sound output from the sides may be affected.

- Do not cover the top of the front speaker. It may interrupt the sound output from the top of the front speaker.



#### 4 Perform [Sound Field Optimization](\*) on the app in the following cases.

- Changing the position and installation method of the speaker system as well as the optional rear speakers and subwoofer
- Connecting the optional rear speakers and/or subwoofer for the first time
- When changing the viewing environment, such as changing the layout of furniture

Using the calibration microphone allows for more accurate measurements.

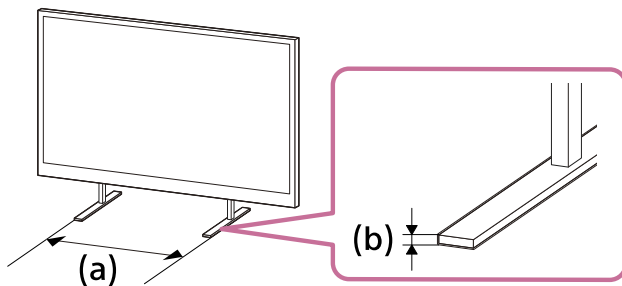
\* Displayed by tapping [Settings] - [Sound Settings] - [Sound Field Optimization] on the remote control screen on the app.

### How to deal with the case where the center speaker cannot be placed properly due to interference of the TV legs

By attaching the supplied foot to the center speaker, the center speaker can be raised above the installation surface, thus avoiding interference with the TV legs.

Attaching of the foot does not improve sound quality.

If the TV leg size corresponds to the following, the center speaker can be installed by attaching the foot.



(a) Spacing between TV legs: 600 mm (23 3/4 in) or less

(b) TV leg height: 8.5 mm (11/32 in) or less

#### 1. Prepare what are needed.

- Foot (2) (supplied)



- Screw (2) (supplied)



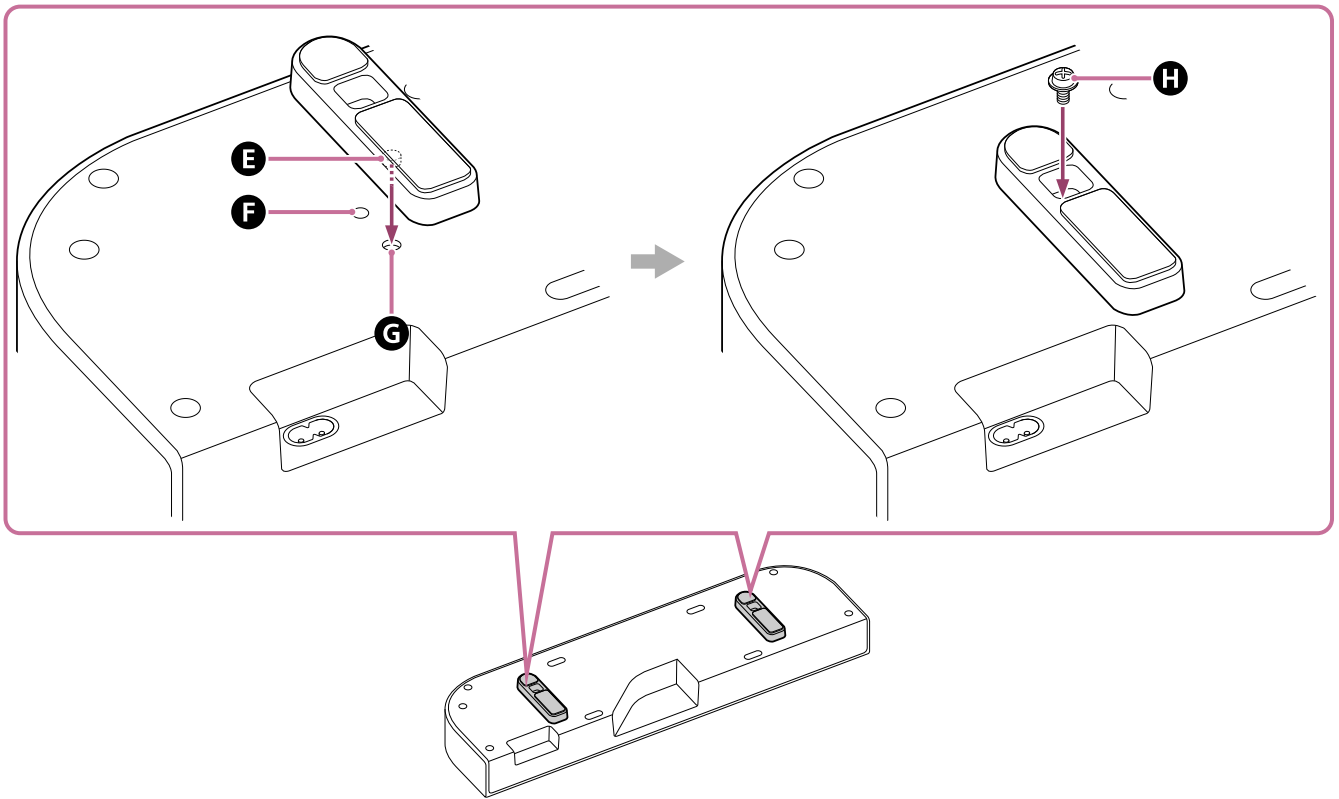
- Phillips screwdriver (not supplied)

#### 2. Attach the foot to the center speaker.

Install the foot according to the following procedure.

- Place the center speaker with the bottom of the center speaker facing up.
- Position the foot by fitting the projecting part on the inside of the foot into the hole for the foot projecting part next to the screw hole on the center speaker.

- Secure the foot with the screw.



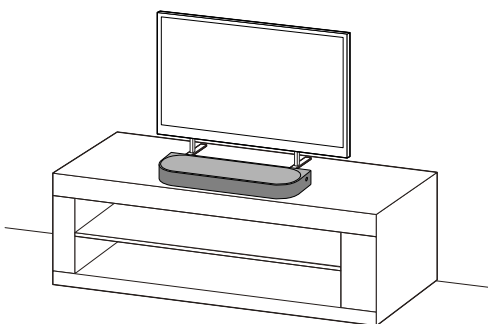
- E** Projecting part

**Hint**

- When attaching/detaching the foot, lay out a soft cloth or a similar material to prevent damage to the center speaker.
- When detaching the foot, after removing the screws, grip the foot and pull while twisting to make it easier to detach.

**3. Install the center speaker.**

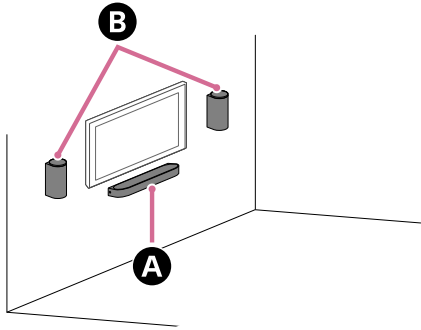
Be careful not to cover the remote control sensor on the TV with the center speaker. After installation, check that the TV can be turned on/off with the TV remote control.



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## Mounting the Center Speaker and Front Speakers on a Wall

Mount the center speaker and front speakers under the TV mounted on a wall.



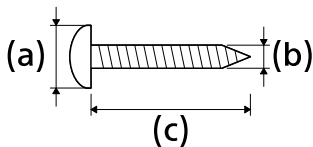
- A** Center speaker
- B** Front speakers

### Note

- Hang the center speaker and front speakers horizontally on the reinforced wall.
- Ask a Sony dealer or licensed contractor to install the center speaker and front speakers securely with full consideration of safety.
- Sony shall not be held responsible for accidents or damage caused by improper installation, lack of installation strength, misuse, or natural disaster.
- Two or more persons are required to hang the center speaker and front speakers for safety.

## Mounting the center speaker on a wall

1. Prepare two screws (not supplied) that are suitable for the holes on the wall mounting bracket (supplied).

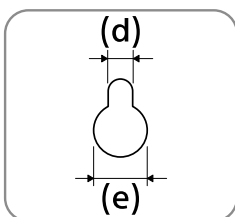


(a) 6 mm to 9.5 mm (1/4 in to 3/8 in)

(b) 4 mm (3/16 in)

(c) 30 mm (1 3/16 in) or longer (Approx.)

Reference: Hole on the wall mounting bracket



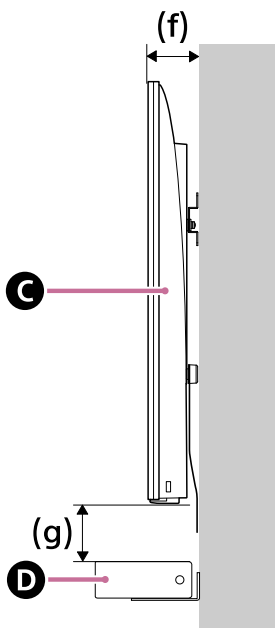
(d) Approx. 5.0 mm (13/64 in)

(e) Approx. 10 mm (25/64 in)

**Note**

- Prepare screws (not supplied) that are suitable for the wall material and stability. The screw may damage the wall depending on the wall material.

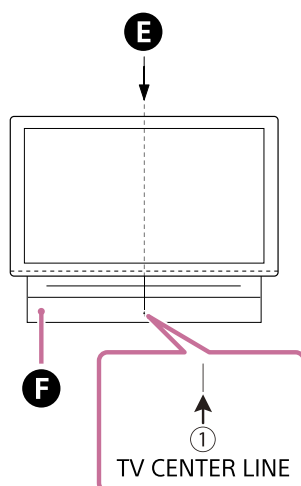
2. Measure the depth of the mounted TV (f) and find out the required space between the bottom of the TV and the top of the center speaker (g).

- D** Center speaker

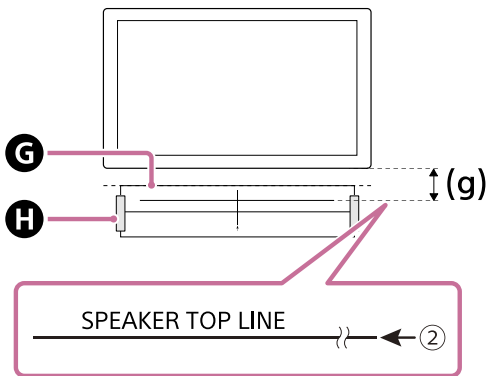
Depth of the mounted TV (f)	Required space between the bottom of the TV and the top of the center speaker (g)

3. Align the vertical line above the “ ↑ ① ” printed on the WALL MOUNT TEMPLATE (Paper) for the center speaker (supplied) with the center of the width of your TV.

4. Align the “ ←② ” mark printed on the WALL MOUNT TEMPLATE for the center speaker with the bottom of the required space between the bottom of TV and the top of the center speaker (g) measured in step 2, then adhere the WALL MOUNT TEMPLATE for the center speaker on the wall with a commercially available adhesive tape, etc.

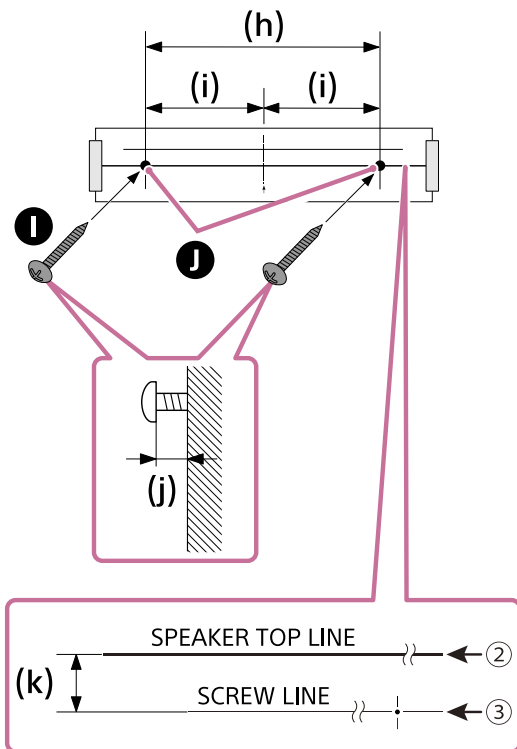


- Ⓒ WALL MOUNT TEMPLATE (Paper) for the center speaker

- When adhering the WALL MOUNT TEMPLATE for the center speaker on the wall, smooth it out fully.

5. Fasten the screws prepared in step 1 securely into the screw marks on the “ ←③ ” printed on the WALL MOUNT TEMPLATE for the center speaker.



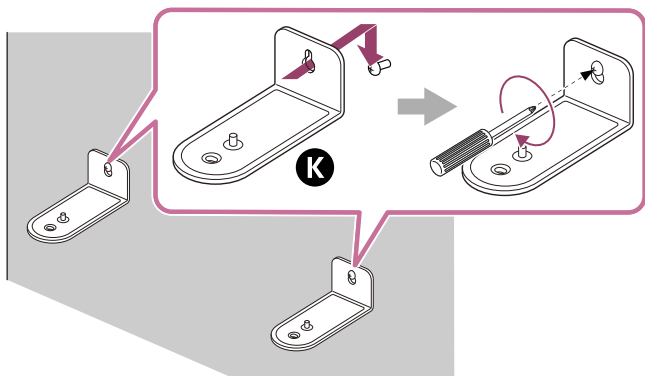

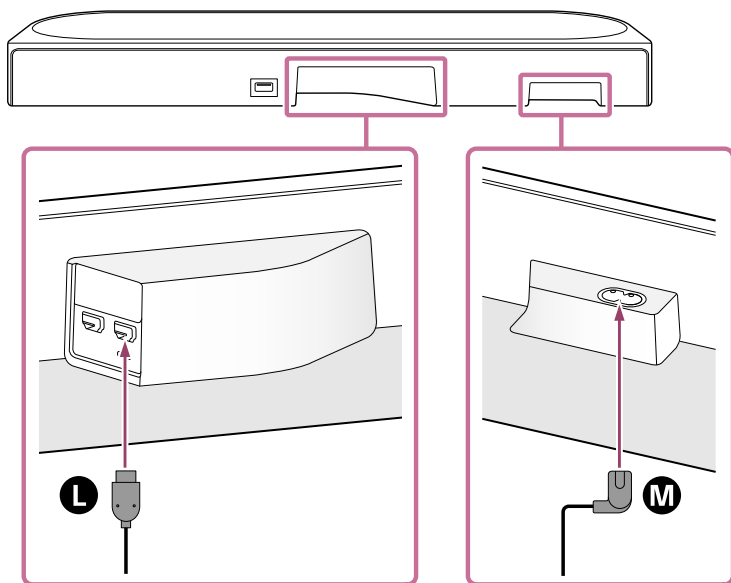
**7. Hang the wall mounting brackets (supplied) on the screws, then fasten the screws to fix the wall mounting brackets to the wall.**

**8. Connect cables to the center speaker.**

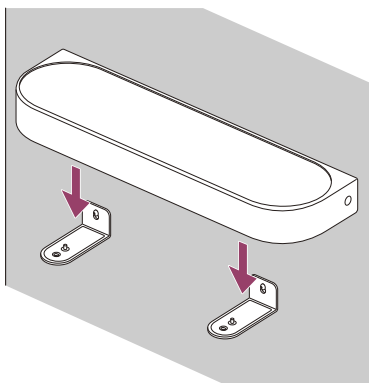
Connect the HDMI cable (supplied) to the HDMI OUT (TV (eARC/ARC)) jack on the center speaker and the AC power cord (mains lead) for the center speaker (supplied) to the AC inlet on the center speaker.



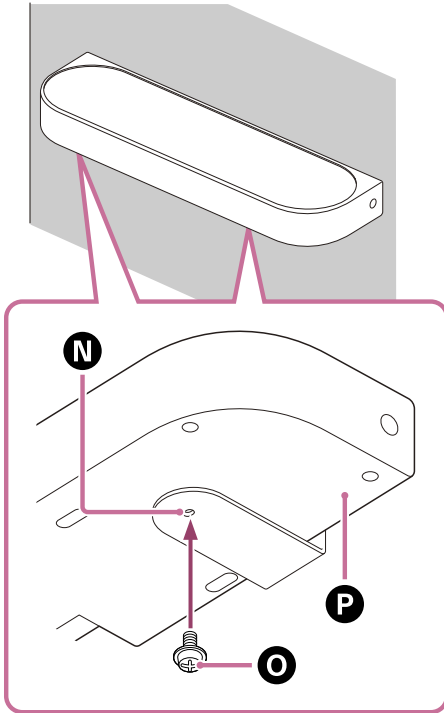
**L** HDMI cable

**M** AC power cord (mains lead) for the center speaker

**9. Put the center speaker on the wall mounting brackets.**



- Align the positions of the screw holes on the bottom of the center speaker and holes of the wall mounting brackets, then fix the center speaker to the wall mounting brackets by fastening the screws (supplied) securely.

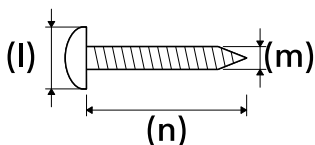

- Connect the AC power cord (mains lead) for the center speaker connected to the center speaker to the AC outlet (mains).

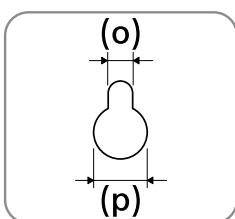
## Mounting the front speakers on a wall

- Prepare two screws (not supplied) that are suitable for the wall mounting holes on the front speakers.

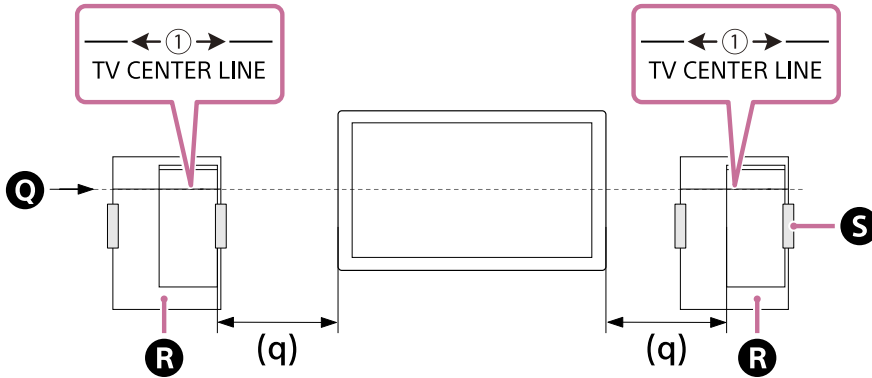

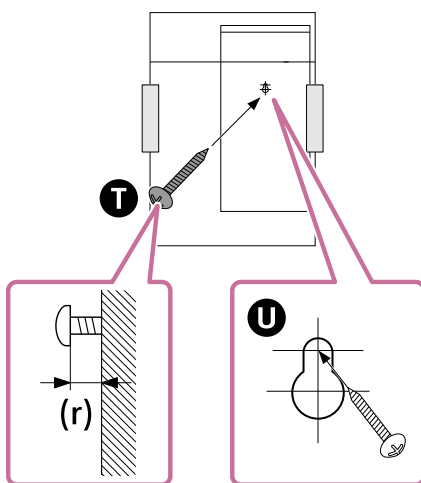
- Prepare screws (not supplied) that are suitable for the wall material and stability. The screw may damage the wall depending on the wall material.

2. Align the horizontal line of the “ ←①→ ” mark printed on the WALL MOUNT TEMPLATE for the front speaker (supplied) with the center of the TV's height, then adhere the WALL MOUNT TEMPLATE for the front speaker on the wall with a commercially available adhesive tape, etc. leaving a gap (q) between the TV. Make sure the gap between the TV is the same on both sides.

3. Fasten the screw prepared in step 1 securely into the screw mark printed on the WALL MOUNT TEMPLATE for the front speaker.

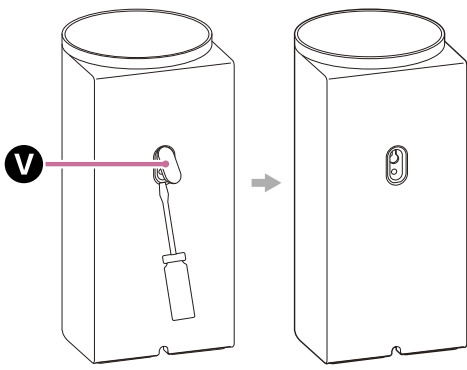

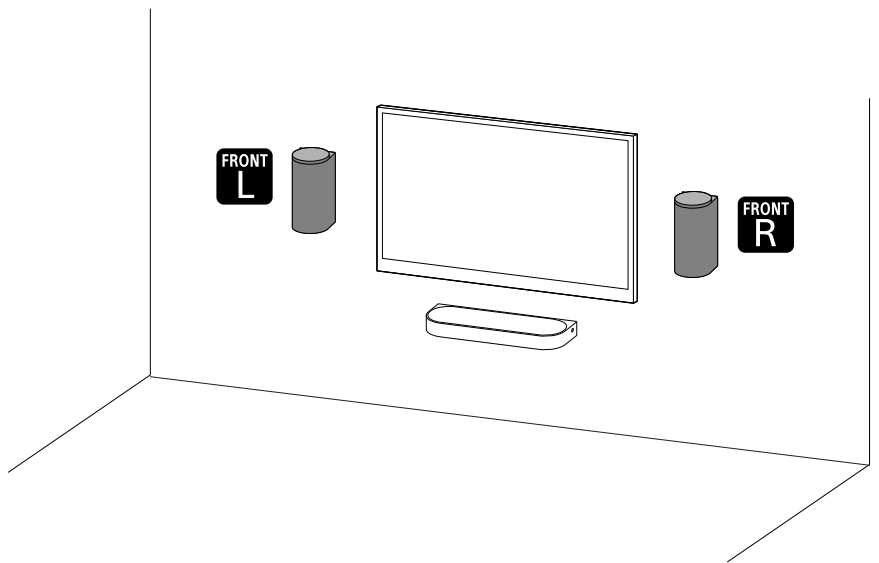
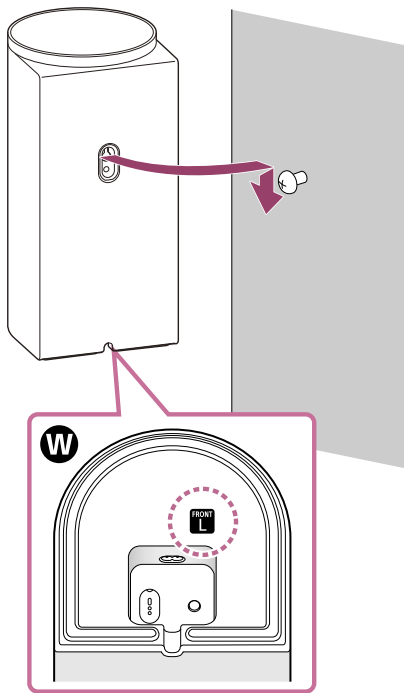

- Connecting the optional rear speakers and/or subwoofer for the first time
- When changing the viewing environment, such as changing the layout of furniture

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## Using with an Optional Subwoofer and Rear Speakers

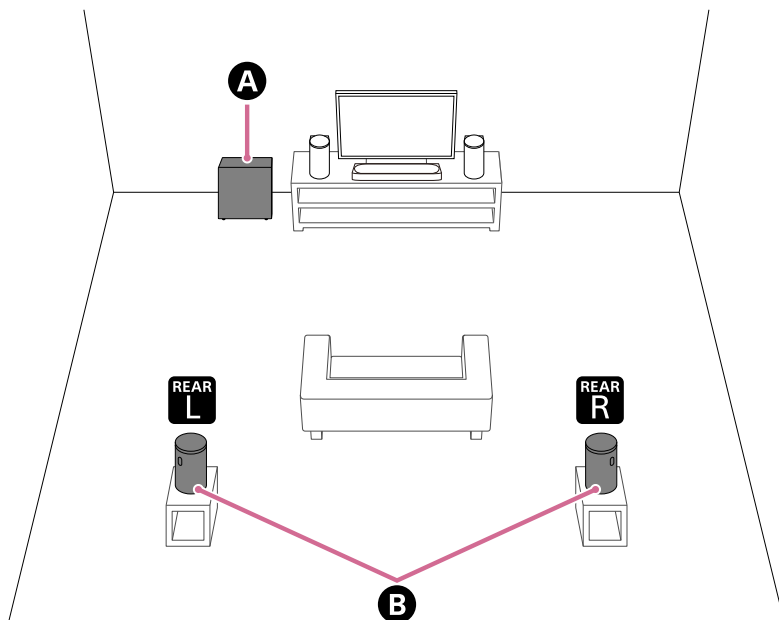
### Installing

This section describes an example of installation using a combination of an optional subwoofer and rear speakers that are compatible with the speaker system.

#### Example of installing the speaker system in combination with a subwoofer and rear speakers

- The sound output from the subwoofer is omni-directional, so the subwoofer can be positioned as desired.
- Rear speakers should be placed in the rear as a pair, facing the viewing position (sound listening position). It is recommended that the height of the rear speakers be placed in line with the height of the ear.

For details, refer to the operating instructions/Help Guide of the optional subwoofer and rear speakers.

- B** Rear speakers (not supplied)

#### Example of installing the speaker system in combination with two subwoofers (dual subwoofer connection)

Two subwoofers can be connected to the speaker system to enjoy more powerful bass sound.

- The sound output from the subwoofer is omni-directional, so the subwoofer can be positioned as desired.
- Depending on the placement and room conditions when two subwoofers are installed, less bass sound may be heard. In that case, select the optimal phase setting (\*) on the app.

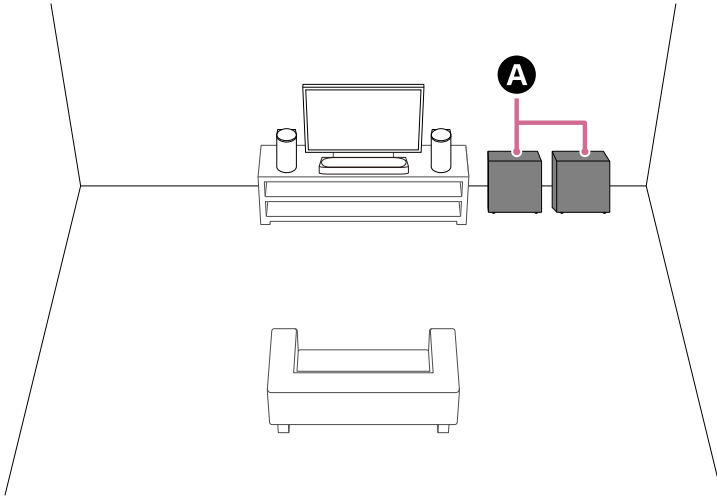
\* Displayed by tapping [Settings] - [Sound Settings] - [Subwoofer phase setting] on the remote control screen on the app.

#### Note

- This speaker system supports the connection of two subwoofers. The subwoofers to be connected must meet the following conditions.

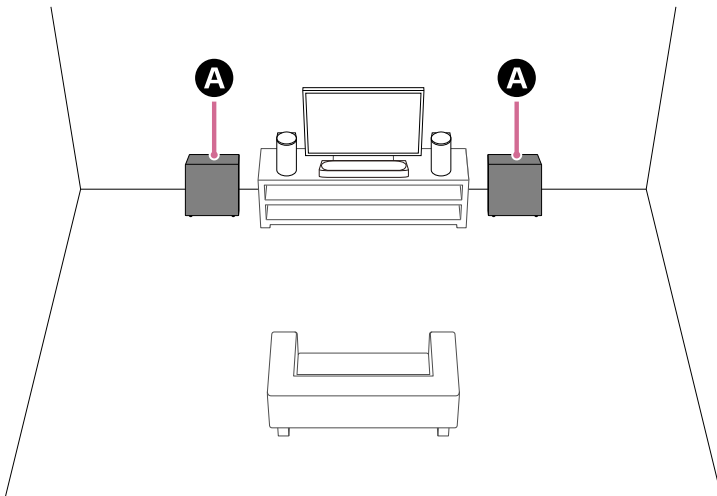
- Have the same model name.
- Support the connection of two subwoofers.
- Check the product specifications on Sony's product information website to confirm if the subwoofers support the connection of two subwoofers.
- The subwoofer may not connect to the speaker system until the software of the speaker system or subwoofer is updated.

Check [Settings] - [Wireless Speaker Settings] - [Wireless Speaker Connection] on the remote control screen on the app.

#### Note

- No audio will be output unless the setup of the optional speakers is completed on the app.

- A software update may be required when using the speaker system with the optional speakers. Perform the software update while the speaker system and the optional speakers are connected to a power source.

## If changing the installation method or position of the speaker system or optional speakers

Perform [Sound Field Optimization](\*) on the app.

Using the calibration microphone allows for more accurate measurements.

\* Displayed by tapping [Settings] - [Sound Settings] - [Sound Field Optimization] on the remote control screen on the app.

### Installing

Refer to the operating instructions supplied with SA-RS5 for installation.

### Connecting SA-RS5 to the speaker system

Set up the speaker system by following the instructions in “Setting up” of [“Using with an Optional Subwoofer and Rear Speakers.”](#)

SA-RS5 has a built-in rechargeable battery. If the SA-RS5 is turned off while being used on battery power, the connection to the speaker system will be disconnected. Press the power button on SA-RS5 to reconnect to the speaker system and the power indicator on the SA-RS5 lights up in green.

You can check the remaining battery level of the built-in rechargeable battery on the remote control screen on the app.

### Changing the position or viewing environment of the speaker system or SA-RS5

Perform [Sound Field Optimization](\*) on the app.

\* Displayed by tapping [Settings] - [Sound Settings] - [Sound Field Optimization] on the remote control screen on the app.

#### Note

- When SA-RS5 is connected to the speaker system, it is not possible to perform sound field optimization by pressing the OPTIMIZE button on SA-RS5. When you change the position of the SA-RS5, perform [Sound Field Optimization] on the app.

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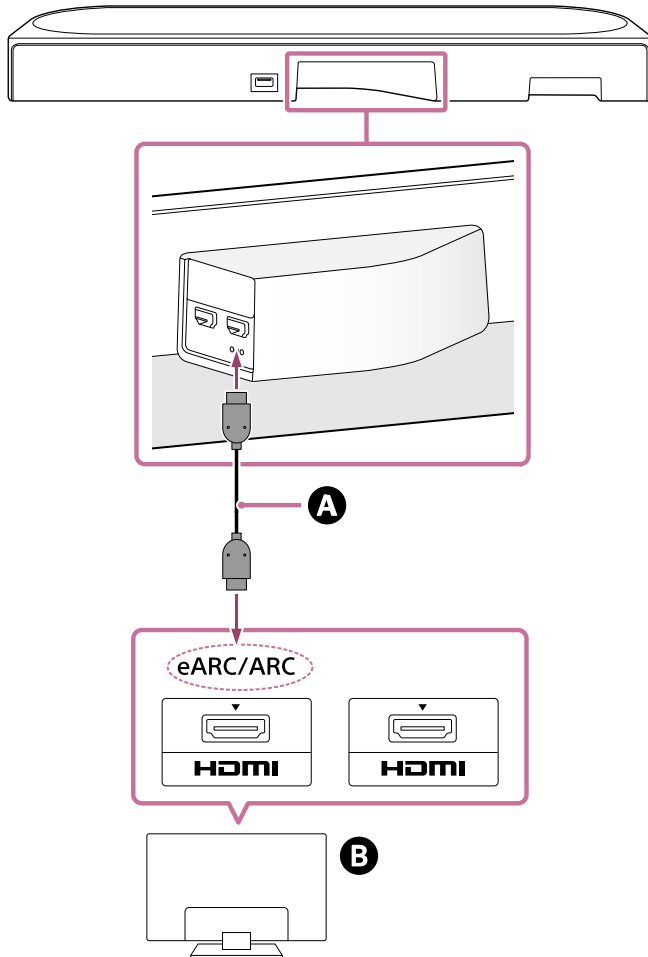

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## Connecting to a TV

- 1 Connect an HDMI IN jack compatible with eARC/ARC on the TV and the HDMI OUT (TV (eARC/ARC)) jack on the speaker system using the HDMI cable (supplied).

### Hint

- There are three tactile dots that are about 1 mm (1/16 in) in size under the HDMI OUT (TV (eARC/ARC)) jack. Use them as a guide during connection.

- 2 Change the TV settings so that TV sound can be output from the speaker system.

Depending on your TV, this may be set automatically when the speaker system is connected. For details, refer to the operating instructions of your TV.

- 3 Enable eARC on both the speaker system and the TV.

If the TV that is connected to the speaker system is compatible with eARC/ARC, the eARC function is available. To enjoy higher quality audio formats such as Dolby Atmos played on an external device connected to the TV, check that the eARC setting is enabled on the speaker system and TV.

- eARC setting for the TV: Refer to the operating instructions of your TV.
- eARC setting for the speaker system: The setting is enabled by default.

**Note**

- Check that the connectors are firmly inserted.
- If the speaker system is not connected to the eARC/ARC-compatible HDMI input of the TV, the TV sound cannot be output from the speaker system.
- Enable the Control for HDMI function on the TV. If the Control for HDMI function on the TV is not enabled, the speaker system does not output TV sound.
- By enabling the eARC function on the TV, some features on the TV may become limited. For instance, system sounds and voice response may not be output. For details, refer to the operating instructions of your TV.

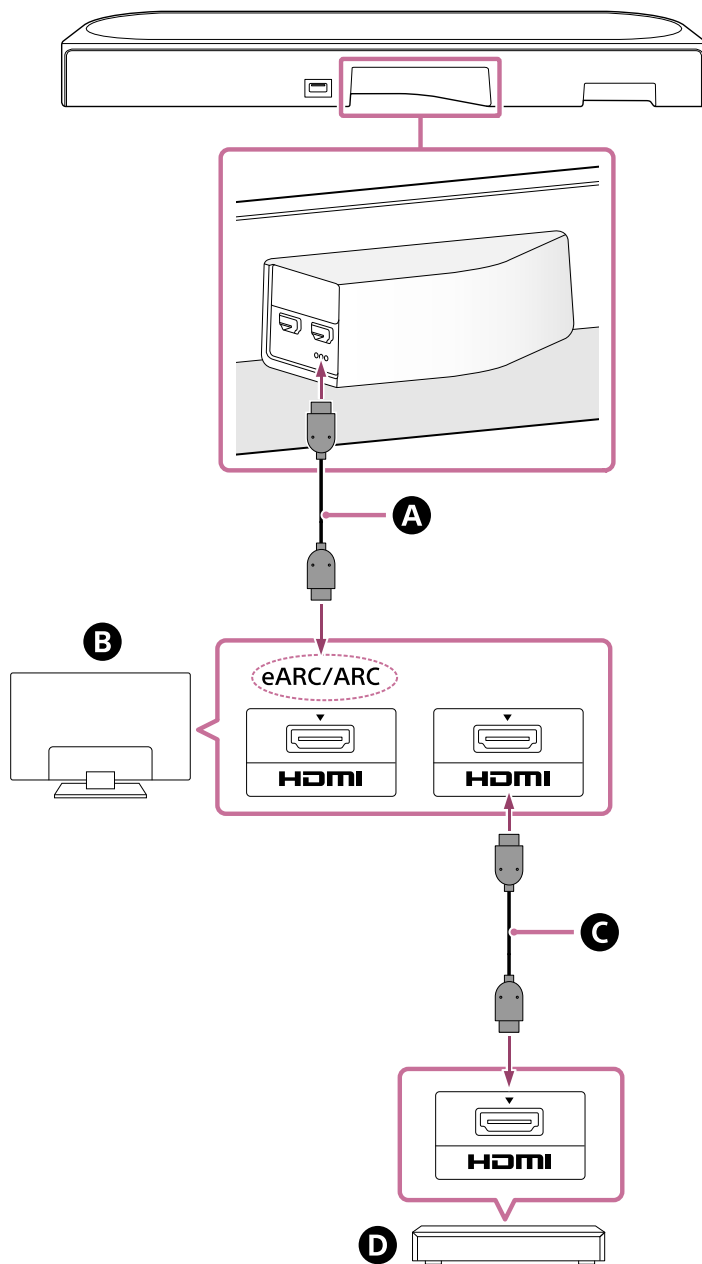
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## Connecting an AV Device

4K/8K video and high-quality audio such as Dolby Atmos, Dolby TrueHD, DTS:X, etc. can be played by connecting an AV device (Blu-ray Disc player, set-top box, cable box, satellite box, gaming console, etc.) in the following way.

- 1 Connect the HDMI OUT jack on the AV device and HDMI IN jack on the TV using an HDMI cable (not supplied).
- 2 Connect the speaker system and TV using the HDMI cable (supplied).

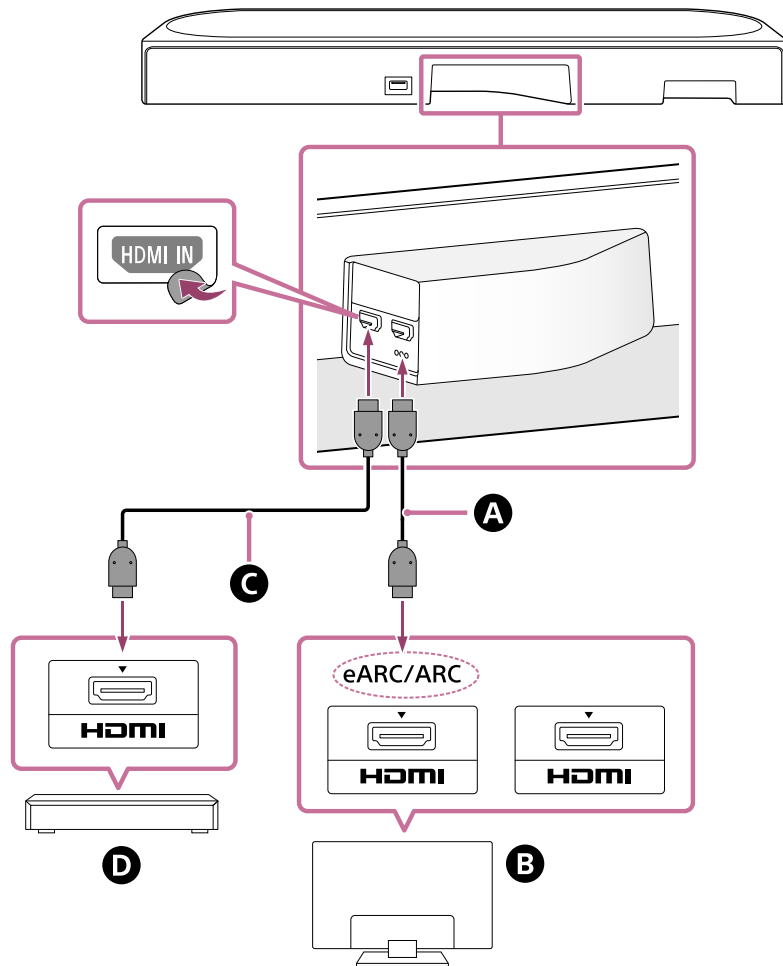


- A** HDMI cable (supplied)

## The AV device can be connected to the speaker system directly

By connecting an AV device directly to the speaker system, higher quality audio formats such as Dolby Atmos that are played on the AV device can also be output from the speaker system, even if the TV is not compatible with eARC.

1. Connect the speaker system and TV using the HDMI cable (supplied).
2. Remove the sticker from the HDMI IN jack on the speaker system.
3. Connect the HDMI IN jack on the speaker system and HDMI OUT jack on the AV device using an HDMI cable (not supplied).

### Note

- Check that the connectors are firmly inserted.
- To view 4K/8K content, the TV and HDMI cable need to be compatible with the video format to be viewed. For details, refer to the operating instructions of the TV.
- Some TV controls may become limited. For instance, system sounds and voice response may not be output. For details, refer to the operating instructions of your TV.
- The types and number of devices that can be controlled by the Control for HDMI function are limited by the HDMI CEC standard as follows.
  - Recording devices (Blu-ray Disc recorder, DVD recorder, etc.): Up to 3 devices
  - Playback devices (Blu-ray Disc player, DVD player, etc.): Up to 3 devices
  - Tuner-related devices: Up to 4 devices
  - Audio system (receiver/headphones): Up to 1 device (used by this speaker system)

## Hint

- Use the HDMI cable that is compatible with the video format of the device being connected, and select the HDMI signal format by accessing [Settings] - [HDMI Settings] - [HDMI Signal Format] on the remote control screen on the app.
- For the supported audio formats, refer to “Related Topic.”
- There are three tactile dots that are about 1 mm (1/16 in) in size under the HDMI OUT (TV (eARC/ARC)) jack. Use them as a guide during connection.

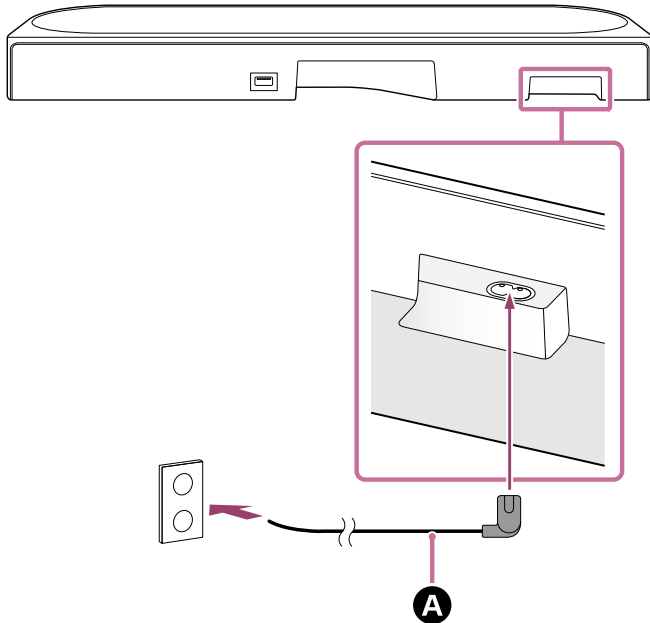

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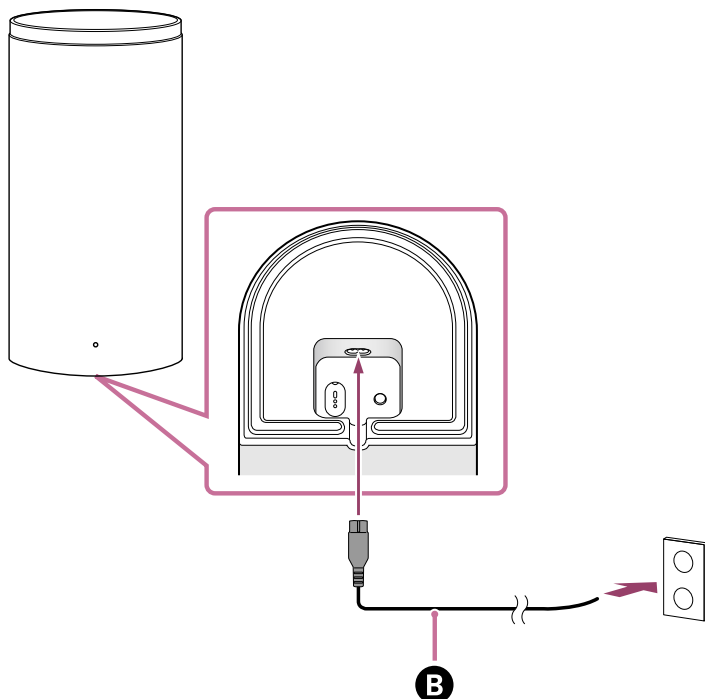

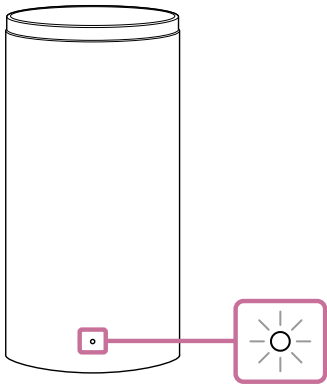
- A** AC power cord (mains lead) for the center speaker (supplied)

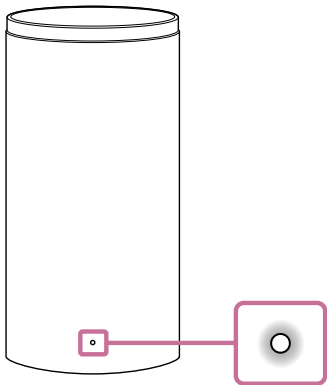

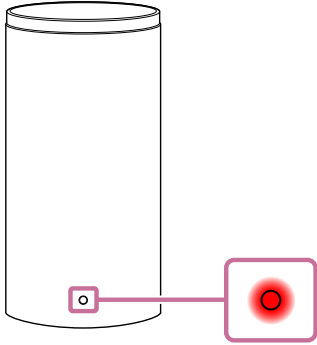

## If the Center Speaker and Front Speakers Are Not Connected Correctly

If the front speaker is not connected to the center speaker correctly, the power indicator on the front speaker lights up in red. Operate as follows on the remote control screen on the app.





### Hint

- Check the speaker connection status in [Settings] - [Wireless Speaker Settings] on the remote control screen on the app.

- 1 Tap [Settings] - [Wireless Speaker Settings] - [Wireless Speaker Connection].
- 2 Follow the instructions on the app.

## To operate using the supplied remote control

1. Press INPUT (Input),  (Muting),  (Muting), INPUT (Input) in sequence within 5 seconds.  
The main status indicator on the center speaker flashes in blue/white alternately, and the connection to the left and right front speakers will be disconnected.
2. Press LINK on the left and right front speakers.  
The power indicators on the front speakers flash twice each in white.  
When the connection is complete, the power indicators on the front speakers light up in white.

### Hint

- When connecting an optional subwoofer or rear speakers, their connections will also be disconnected. Press LINK on the optional subwoofer or rear speakers to reconnect them.

## Listening to TV Sound

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Operate the remote control screen on the app as follows.

- 1 Tap the playback information/input switching area on the upper part of the screen to switch the input to [TV].

If the remote control screen on the app that can operate the speaker system and BRAVIA is displayed, there is no need to operate the input switching of the speaker system. The audio input on the speaker system switches in conjunction with the content being viewed on the TV.

- 2 Adjust the volume.

### To operate using the supplied remote control

1. Press INPUT (Input) to light the main status indicator on the center speaker in white.
2. Adjust the volume.

#### Note

- If there is no picture when TV (eARC/ARC) input is selected, select the preferred TV channel by using the TV remote control.

## Playing the Connected AV Device

- If HDR content cannot be shown in high dynamic range, check that the settings of the TV or device connected to the speaker system. For details, refer to the operating instructions supplied with the TV or connected device.
- Depending on the [HDMI Signal Format] setting, an AV device may not be able to output HDR content in the HDR format. Access [Settings] - [HDMI Settings] and change the [HDMI Signal Format] settings on the remote control screen on the app to accommodate the video format that is supported by the AV device.
- If the picture and sound of the device that is connected to the speaker system are not output from the TV while the speaker system is turned off, access [Settings] - [HDMI Settings] - [Signal Pass Through] and set this to [Auto] or [On] on the remote control screen on the app.

## Adjusting Sound Quality

The following sound quality adjustments can be performed on the remote control screen on the app or on the supplied remote control.

### Operating using the remote control screen on the app

When an app-compatible BRAVIA is connected to the speaker system using an HDMI cable, select [Picture & Sound].

- **[Sound field]**  
Outputs sound with the surround sound effect. This setting can be used to experience surround sound with a sense of presence.
- **[Voice mode]**  
Emphasizes dialog and makes it easier to hear.
- **[Voice Zoom]**  
This function is enabled when a Sony TV compatible with the linkage function of the speaker system is connected. When TV input is selected on the speaker system, the voice zoom works instead of the voice mode. The voice zoom can adjust only the volume of the human voice without changing the overall volume. The voice volume of the newscaster can be adjusted to be louder to make it easier to hear, and the voice volume can be adjusted to be quieter for live sports broadcasts or other situations where the commentary or play-by-play commentary is too loud.
- **[Night mode]**  
Outputs clear sound even at a low volume for late night use and features clear dialog and minimum loss of fidelity.

### Operating using the supplied remote control

Each time you press a button on the supplied remote control, the setting changes and the setting status can be checked on the sub status indicator on the center speaker.

When set to on: The sub status indicator lights up once for a longer time in white.

When set to off: The sub status indicator flashes twice in white.

- **SOUND FIELD (Sound field)**  
Outputs sound with the surround sound effect. This setting can be used to experience surround sound with a sense of presence.
- **VOICE (Voice mode)**  
Emphasizes dialog and makes it easier to hear.  
The voice zoom works to adjust the volume of human voices when a TV compatible with the linkage function of the speaker system is connected. When voice zoom is turned on, the last adjusted value in the TV menu or remote control screen on the app will be applied.
- **NIGHT (Night mode)**  
Outputs clear sound even at a low volume for late night use and features clear dialog and minimum loss of fidelity.

#### Note

- The settings related to sound effects selected on the remote control screen on the app or the supplied remote control are not available during test tone output.
- If [Sound Field Setting] is set to [Dolby Speaker Virtualizer] and the sound field(\*) is set to on, the voice mode(\*) is disabled.

- Depending on the combination of settings for sound effects selected on the remote control screen on the app or the supplied remote control and the content being played, the [Sound Field Optimization] effect may not apply, or some speakers may not output sound.
- The sense of presence that can be achieved by the surround sound processing may vary depending on the playback content.
- When playing multi-channel audio, check the digital audio output setting on the device that is connected to the speaker system. For details, refer to the operating instructions supplied with the connected device.
- The night mode(\*) automatically turns off when the speaker system is turned off.

- Depending on the TV setting or the content being played, the voice zoom may not work.

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## Listening to Music by Pairing the BLUETOOTH Device that is Connected for the First Time

To use the BLUETOOTH function, the speaker system and BLUETOOTH device need to be paired in advance. Pairing is the process of registering devices with each other in advance.

### 1 Turn on the BLUETOOTH device.

### 2 Switch the input to [Bluetooth] on the remote control screen on the app.

If another BLUETOOTH device is already connected to the speaker system, select [Connect to other devices]. The speaker system enters the pairing mode and the main status indicator on the center speaker flashes twice repeatedly in blue by switching to the [Bluetooth] input without a paired device.

### 3 Look for the speaker system on the BLUETOOTH device by performing the pairing operation.

The list of the BLUETOOTH devices detected by the BLUETOOTH device appears on the screen of the BLUETOOTH device.

For how to perform pairing with the BLUETOOTH device, refer to the operating instructions of the BLUETOOTH device.

### 4 Select the speaker system(\*) from the list of devices that is displayed on the screen of the BLUETOOTH device and register the speaker system and BLUETOOTH device with each other.

If a passkey is requested, enter "0000."

\* BRAVIA Theatre Trio or the device name that is set in [Unit Name].


### 5 Confirm on the remote control screen on the app that the speaker system and the BLUETOOTH device are connected via the BLUETOOTH function.

The connected BLUETOOTH device name is displayed on the remote control screen on the app.

### 6 Start audio playback with the music app on the connected BLUETOOTH device.

Sound is output from the speaker system.

### 7 Adjust the volume.

Adjust the speaker system volume using the remote control screen on the app, music playback app, or  (Volume) + (plus)/- (minus) on the supplied remote control.

Play or pause the content by tapping the playback operation icon on the remote control screen on the app.

#### Note

- If pairing fails, try performing the following on the BLUETOOTH device.
  - Accept pairing request.
  - If the maximum number of paired devices on the BLUETOOTH device has been reached, remove any unneeded devices.

- If the speaker system has been reset, delete the pairing information for the speaker system from the BLUETOOTH device and perform pairing again.

### Hint

- If there is no BLUETOOTH device paired (when using the speaker system immediately after purchase, etc.), the speaker system enters the pairing mode when the input is simply changed to [Bluetooth].
- Perform pairing for a second or subsequent BLUETOOTH device.

## Listening to Music from the Paired BLUETOOTH Device

**1 Turn on the BLUETOOTH function on the BLUETOOTH device.**

If you cannot connect to the BLUETOOTH device that you used in step 1, select [Connect to other devices] on the remote control screen on the app. Then, use the BLUETOOTH device that you used in step 1 to select the speaker system as the device being connected to for the BLUETOOTH function.

3. Start audio playback with the music app on the connected BLUETOOTH device.
4. Adjust the volume.

#### Hint

- If a BLUETOOTH connection is not established between the speaker system and BLUETOOTH device, select the speaker system on the BLUETOOTH device.
- If sound delay occurs, it may be improved by accessing [Settings] - [Bluetooth Settings] - [Bluetooth Connection Quality] and set this to [Priority on Stable Connection] on the remote control screen on the app.

### To disconnect the BLUETOOTH device

Use one of the following methods to disconnect.

- Turn off the BLUETOOTH function on the BLUETOOTH device.
- Turn off the speaker system or BLUETOOTH device.

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## Setting the Wireless Function to On or Off

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The wireless function is set to on by default.

- Press INPUT (Input),  (Volume) – (minus), and  (Muting) on the supplied remote control in this order to turn off the BLUETOOTH and Wireless LAN function. The sub status indicator on the center speaker flashes twice in white.

## Operating the Speaker System by Interlocking with a TV (Control for HDMI Function)

Speaker system controls such as power on/off or volume adjustment can be interlocked with a TV's controls by using an HDMI cable to connect the speaker system with a TV that is compatible with the Control for HDMI function.

### About the Control for HDMI function

The Control for HDMI function is a function that interlocks devices that are connected using an HDMI (High-Definition Multimedia Interface) cable so that these devices can be operated together.

Although this function is supported by devices that are compatible with the Control for HDMI function, it may not work if devices other than those manufactured by Sony are connected.

### Preparing to operate the speaker system by interlocking it with a TV

Enable the Control for HDMI function settings on the TV that is connected to the speaker system using an HDMI cable. The Control for HDMI function setting on the speaker system is enabled by default.

#### Note

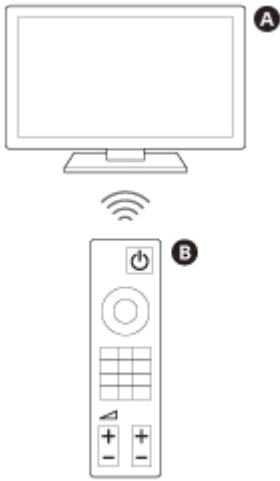
- The TV needs to be compatible with the Control for HDMI function. For details, refer to the operating instructions of the TV.

**Press and hold  (Power) on the center speaker for more than 10 seconds until the resetting notification sound is heard.**

When resetting is complete, the center speaker will restart.

Wait until the main status indicator on the center speaker flashes in white, followed by the power on notification sound.

### Resetting the front speaker

Reset the left and right front speakers respectively.

**1. With the power on, press and hold LINK on the front speaker for more than 10 seconds until the resetting notification sound is heard.**

The reset starts when the power indicator on the front speaker flashes in white/blue alternately and the resetting notification sound is heard. When the reset is complete, the power indicator will stop flashing, the power on notification sound will play, and the front speaker will turn off.

**2. Turn on the front speaker by pressing LINK on the front speaker.**

#### Note

- When the speaker system is reset, delete the pairing information for the speaker system (name of the speaker system (\*\*), LE\_name of the speaker system) from the BLUETOOTH setting on the smartphone(\*), etc. connected to the speaker system.
  - \* Smartphones with the app installed, audio devices compatible with the BLUETOOTH function, etc.

### About the [HDMI Signal Format] setting

When [Settings] - [HDMI Settings] - [HDMI Signal Format] on the remote control screen on the app is set to [Enhanced format (4K120, 8K)], all video formats that are supported by the speaker system can be input.

When [HDMI Signal Format] is set to [Enhanced format], the video format is limited to 4K 60 Hz 4:4:4, 4:2:2, etc.

When [HDMI Signal Format] is set to [Standard format], the video format is limited to 4K 60 Hz 4:2:0, 4K 24 Hz, etc.

### About the HDMI cable to use

Use an HDMI-authorized cable.

Use the supplied HDMI cable to connect to a TV.

An Ultra High Speed HDMI Cable capable 48 Gbps supports all video formats that are supported by the speaker system.

A Premium High Speed HDMI Cable with Ethernet capable 18 Gbps supports video formats up to 4K 60 Hz 4:4:4, 4:2:2, etc.

### About the 3D signal

The following video format is compatible with 3D signal in Side-by-Side (Half) format.

- 1080i 50/60 Hz

The following video formats are compatible with 3D signal in Frame packing and Over-Under (Top-and Bottom) formats.

- 1080p 24 Hz
- 720p 50/60 Hz

### About HDMI connection

The HDMI jack of the speaker system supports video signals up to 4K 120/144 Hz/8K, HDR (High Dynamic Range)(\*1), VRR(\*2), ALLM(\*3), SBTM(\*4), QMS(\*5), and HDCP2.3 standard(\*6).

\*1 HDR is a vivid video standard that is capable of representing a wider range of (bright and dark) luminance. The speaker system supports HDR10, HLG (Hybrid Log-Gamma), and Dolby Vision.

\*2 VRR (Variable Refresh Rate) is a video transmission method that can suppress video stuttering and display images smoothly by adjusting the refresh rate on the display side to match the frame rate of games, etc.

\*3 ALLM (Auto Low Latency Mode) is a function that automatically switches to low latency mode in conjunction with the output of games, etc.

\*4 SBTM (Source-Based Tone Mapping) is a function that allows AV device to generate and display HDR images that are optimized for the characteristics of the TV.

\*5 QMS (Quick Media Switching) is a feature that allows seamless switching of video frame rates.

\*6 HDCP2.3 is a copyright protection technology to protect content such as 4K video and 8K video.



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## Notes on Use

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### Precautions

- The supplied AC power cord (mains lead) is designed exclusively for this speaker system. It should not be used with any other device.
- Unplug the AC power cord (mains lead) from the AC outlet (mains) when the speaker system is not being used for long periods of time. When unplugging the AC power cord (mains lead) from the AC outlet (mains), always unplug it by holding the plug. Never pull the cord itself.
- If the AC power cord (mains lead) is damaged, contact Sony support or the store you purchased the product from for a replacement.

### On placement

- Do not place the speaker system near heat sources or in a location subject to direct sunlight, excessive dust, or mechanical shock. These conditions may cause malfunction.
- Place this speaker system on a flat, level surface. When placed on a sloped surface, the speaker system may fall over or fall off the surface due to its own vibration, resulting in injuries, malfunctions, or performance degradation.
- Placing the speaker system on a floor that is coated with special paint, wax, grease, or solvent, etc. may result in discoloration or stains on the floor.
- The speakers of the speaker system are not the magnetically shielded type. Do not place magnetic cards on the speaker system or near it.
- Do not place metal objects other than a TV around the speaker system. Wireless functions may become unstable.
- When the speaker system is used with a tuner, TV, or VCR, noise or distorted images may be produced. In this case, install the speaker system away from these devices.
- Do not place the speaker system near objects that emit a strong magnetic field, such as microwave ovens or large speakers.

### How to care for the speaker system

- Dust and dirt on the fabric part should be removed with a soft cloth by applying light pressure.
  - Scratching dirt with fingernails or applying excessive force may damage the fabric part.
  - Do not use cleaning brushes, etc. as they may damage the fabric part depending on the material.
  - If the fabric part is heavily soiled, wipe it with a soft cloth slightly moistened with neutral detergent, then wipe it with a soft dry cloth. Use of non-neutral detergents or cleaners may cause color fading or fabric damage.
- The cabinet should be wiped with a soft cloth slightly moistened with neutral detergent. Do not use abrasive pads, cleansers, or solvents such as alcohol or benzine.

### On BLUETOOTH communications

- BLUETOOTH wireless technology is a short-range wireless technology that enables communication between digital devices, such as smartphones and computers. The maximum communication range may vary depending on the presence of obstacles (people, metal objects, walls, etc.) or the electromagnetic environment.
- Microwaves that are generated by a BLUETOOTH device may affect the operation of electronic medical devices. Turn off the speaker system and other BLUETOOTH devices in the following locations, as it may cause an accident:
  - In hospitals, near priority seating on trains, locations where inflammable gas is present, near automatic doors, or near fire alarms.
- The speaker system supports security functions that comply with the BLUETOOTH security standard during communication using BLUETOOTH wireless technology. However, depending on the configured settings and other

factors, this security may be insufficient. Be careful when using BLUETOOTH communication.

- Sony shall assume no responsibility for any damages or loss resulting from data leaks that may occur when using BLUETOOTH communications.
- BLUETOOTH connection is not guaranteed to work with all BLUETOOTH devices.
  - BLUETOOTH devices being connected with the speaker system must comply with the BLUETOOTH standard prescribed by Bluetooth SIG, Inc. and must be certified as compliant.
  - Even when a connected device complies with the above BLUETOOTH standard, depending on the characteristics and specifications of the device, it may not be able to connect, or the operation method, display, or operation may differ.
- Noise may occur or the audio may cut out depending on the BLUETOOTH device that is connected with the speaker system, the communications environment, or surrounding conditions.
- Depending on the connected device, it may take some time for communications to start.

## Other notes

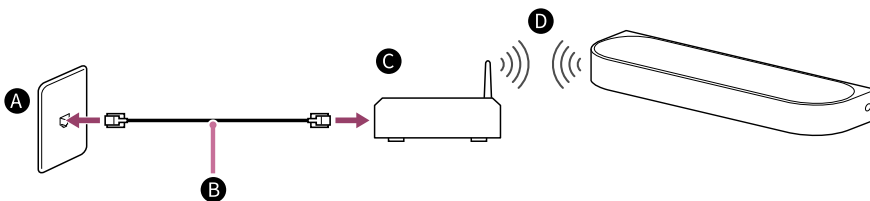
- The temperature of the speaker system may rise during use. This is not a malfunction.
- If a foreign object or water gets into the speaker system, turn off the speaker system immediately, unplug the speaker system from the AC outlet (mains), and consult with Sony support or the store you purchased the product from.
- When connecting the speaker system to the Internet, connect it via a router(\*) with the appropriate security settings. If there is a security issue, the speaker system may be subject to malware (malicious software) attacks, etc. over the internet. Your information and digital assets may be exposed to threats such as extraction and falsification. The speaker system may also damage other network services without your knowledge.

\* A router is a device that relays between an internet line and a local network line.

There are the following types of routers:

- Wired router
- ADSL modem with router function
- Optical network unit (ONU) with router function
- Wi-Fi access point with router function (wireless LAN router)
- Wall socket (wall outlet) device with network line (\*\*)

\*\* If you are uncertain whether a wall socket (wall outlet) device with a network line has a router function, check with the manager of the housing complex or the internet provider.

### Note

- Check that the router is turned on.
  - Check the network connection and network settings.
  - When a wireless LAN router is being used, the communication range may become shorter depending on the usage environment (including the wall material), radio wave reception conditions, or obstacles between the speaker system and wireless LAN router. Move the speaker system and wireless LAN router closer to each other.
  - Devices that use a 2.4 GHz frequency band, such as microwaves, BLUETOOTH devices, or digital cordless devices, may interrupt communication. Move the speaker system away from such devices, or turn off such devices.
  - A wireless LAN connection may become unstable depending on the usage environment, especially while the BLUETOOTH function is being used on the speaker system. Try to improve your wireless LAN usage environment.
